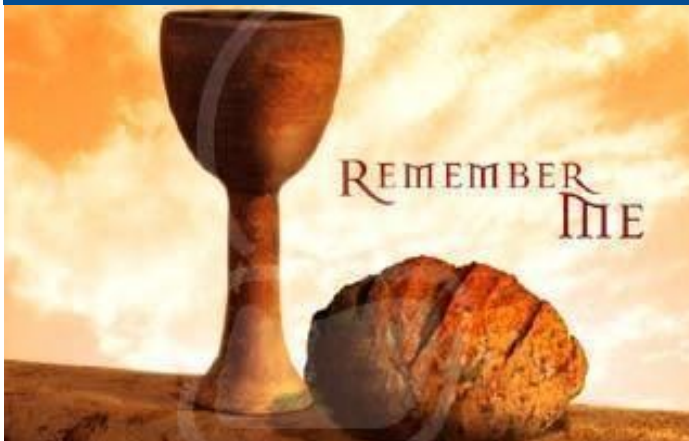

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM THE PASTOR

As we continue to move through August on our way to September and the beginning of school, we're trying to get in as much as we can to whatever is left of the summer. Summer always seems to go too fast, so it's important that we take advantage of whatever time is left of it.

To those who seem to be skeptical about global warming, the latest report is that 2016 was the hottest year on record. With the continued melting of the ice caps, and the increase in carbon dioxide emissions, the earth will only get warmer. The other concern is the rising of the ocean level. This could result in widespread flooding of our coasts and cities, with a number of them being under water in the not too distant future. This may seem cataclysmic, but if government leaders around the world, including our own, take the appropriate steps to deter this, the effects may not seem as bad as predicted. 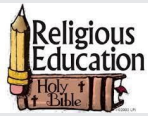
