FROM THE PASTOR

On behalf of the Parish Staff, the Pastoral Council, the entire parish and myself, I want to welcome **Bishop Manny Cruz, Regional Bishop of Union County,** to our parish. Manny will celebrate the Eucharist with us today, and install me as the pastor of Saint James the Apostle. **WELCOME, BIENVENIDA, OBISPO CRUZ!!**

The Spirit of the Lord was upon Jesus and it allowed him to proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom. But not everyone wanted to hear what he had to say. Some of the temple leaders were too interested in guarding their own positions and status within the community. They saw Jesus as a threat to them and their authority. There were others, though, who saw Jesus as someone who spoke and acted differently. He brought a message of hope, compassion, mercy and forgiveness, which they had not heard of before. For Jesus, the message of the kingdom was summed up in him; although he let his words and actions speak for him.

Do we also understand that the Spirit of the Lord is upon us as well? We are also sent to bring the Good News of God to others. As ambassadors of the Gospel, we are signs of his presence and reminders that he is present in and through us. We bring the freedom of Jesus to those held captive because of their unwillingness to let Jesus direct their lives. We are the ones entrusted with the Good News so that it becomes as much a reality in their lives as it is in ours. When we respond to the needs of others, we free them from the burdens inhibiting them from experiencing Christ in their lives. When we bring them the presence of Christ, we do so in the name of the Father.

This is the year that is acceptable to the Father and his great love for us. But we have to be willing to cooperate with the grace of God so that his presence resounds in our lives. Our words and actions are supposed to reflect what our faith in Jesus means to us as we are the sign of the love of Jesus for each other. But who has time for this? After all we all have lives, families and responsibilities, so how can we do all of what is expected? Very simply, it's because this is what we are called to do and we have accepted this responsibility by virtue of our baptism.

This does not mean that it will always be easy or even what we want to do. But it is a part of our relationship with God, who allows us to radiate his Good News to others. We must always remember that the Kingdom of God is revealed in each one of us, and we have to be able to live what the Kingdom of God means to us. We are the ones sent to bring the Good News of Jesus up close and personal to those we meet. Yes, it is an awesome responsibility. Are you up to the task, willing to allow Jesus to lead and guide you? If so, let us proceed together!!

CANDLE BLESSING ON THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION

Tuesday Evening, February 2, 2016 at 7:00PM.

On February 2nd the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also called Candlmas Day, on which candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the Light of the World. According to Luke's account of the Gospel, Simeon recognized Jesus as the Messiah in the Temple and



declared him "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel" (Luke 2:32). This sparked the tradition of blessing enough candles to last an entire year. This led to candle processions in churches and in the streets, which became known as "Candlmas."

Please plan on joining us for Holy Mass, parishioners are invited to bring a candle which will be blessed at the mass. We will gather in the church as we usually do. Once we are in place, our candles will be lit. The priest then begins Mass with the blessing and sprinkling of candles, followed by the procession.

Saint James the Apostle School Students also serve at School Masses and weekday funeral Masses.


All servers, including those in the Religious Ed program, are needed and encouraged to join this ministry.

EXTRACURRICULAR HIGHLIGHTS AT SAINT JAMES THE APOSTLE SCHOOL

When it comes to extracurricular activities... there's something for everyone at Saint James the Apostle School. Here are some of the highlights:

Students in Grades 3-8 who have received the Sacrament of First Eucharist have the opportunity to be **Altar Servers** and serve at Sunday masses, funerals and monthly school masses. Altar Server training is scheduled during the school lunch period making it convenient for students and their parents.

Saint James the Apostle School offers **Forensics**. Students in Grades 5-8 are eligible to compete in public speaking competitions. There are three competitions a year and students also compete once a year at local high schools like Union Catholic and Mount Saint Mary Academy.

The National Junior Honor Society honors those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service, citizenship and character. In the second year of operation at our school, it has afforded these student leaders the opportunity to serve our school community.

Students in Grades 6-8 are able to serve as members of **Student Council** which meets on a weekly basis to develop a variety of service and fundraising projects to aid the school, parish and local community.

Girls Club is an opportunity to spend time with other girls in a faith-based setting, to build/strengthen friendships, learn more about God, and foster an attitude of gratitude and service.

Our in-school and after-school **Fine Arts program** consists of Music, Art and Writing. Once a week, students have the opportunity for music lessons through our partnership with **Partesi Music**. The **Art Program** consists of three different Art Clubs for students in Grades 1-8, which meet once a month after school. In addition, a winter **Writing Workshop** is offered annually by Saint James alumni for students in Grades 4 and 5.

Student Ambassadors are 8th grade students who have been selected to provide tours of the school to prospective parents. Students are trained by the graduating class and school staff. Who better to talk about Saint James the Apostle School than the very students who attend?

Students also have opportunities in sports including CYO Basketball, CYO Volleyball and the newest offering, TGA Premier Golf.
