SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

FROM THE PASTOR

"HE IS KING OF KINGS, HE IS LORD OF LORDS. JESUS CHRIST, THE FIRST AND THE LAST, NO ONE WORKS LIKE HIM..."

(An Easter Sourcebook: The Fifty Days, p. 115)

When Ed Koch was Mayor of New York City, he always asked the question: "How am I doing?" I am not sure whether it was a rhetorical question or not, but he always received a response. At this point in the Easter Season, as we are approaching its end, we can ask ourselves the same question. How are we doing in our relationship with God, and our reflecting on the Easter experience in our lives? Or to put it a different way, do our attitudes, words and actions reflect the new life of the risen Lord? Or have we fallen into the same old routine bit, with no hope of any change? If we cannot radiate the new life and hope of the Risen Lord, then it is difficult for us to follow him, much less call ourselves his disciples.

By his death and resurrection, Jesus has given us a new way to think, speak and behave. He has invited us to become involved with him, so much so that our lives are radically changed because of this significant event. This does not mean that we go through life with a constant smile on our face, or a prayer book in our hands. What it does mean is that because our lives are radically different, so is our behavior. As a result of the resurrection, we are a visible, viable and credible sign of Jesus Christ to others. Then we can help effect a change in others because of who we are and how we live. It's an awesome responsibility, but it happens by virtue of our baptism.

In the old Communist world, before everything came crashing down in 1989, today was May Day. This was the day when there were parades to showcase the workers and the latest in warfare ordnance. The day was supposed to highlight the worker as someone who was important to the success of Communism. But mostly, it was about the military arsenal. The Catholic Church responded by making this day the Feast of St. Joseph, the Worker. As a carpenter, Joseph offers all workers not just the gift of work as essential to human development, but especially the worker as a sign of God, as he calls all of us to use our gifts and talents to help build his kingdom on earth.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is reminding his apostles that even though he will be leaving them to return to the father, he will remain with them in Spirit to help them carry out the mission, which is to bring the Good News to others. They were afraid that they would be left alone and because of this, fail in their efforts. Little did they know that Jesus had plans for them and for his Spirit to remain with them always. They finally understood this on Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came upon them, which allowed them to accomplish their task. He also reassures us that he is with us which also allows us to proclaim his Good News to others, as he sends us forth as ambassadors of him.

Now that the festival is over, over the next few weeks as bills are paid, I'll share those totals with you here. Hopefully, it was a successful event for us.

So, then, "how are you doing?"

Parish Needs

Support of Local Parish Projects

The main purpose of the *We Are Living Stones* Campaign is to strengthen our parish communities. The physical needs of our parish now and into the future are of great concern.

It is projected that the parishes of the Archdiocese will need almost \$125 million over the next ten years to ensure that the 1,100 church, school and rectory buildings, parish centers, ministry offices and other buildings where we engage in the work of the Church are kept in good condition.

Once a parish has reached their *Works of Mercy* target, 50% of all funds raised will be return back to the parish while simultaneously funding additional case elements that both directly and indirectly benefit our parishes.

The indirect parish support is as follows:

- Parish Renewal Fund
- Tuition Assistance Endowment
- Retired Priest Care and Medical Needs Endowment
- Seminarian Support Endowment

When combined with the direct \$40 million in support to the parishes, these items make up over 80% of the funding that will be generated by this Campaign.

What will we do with our portion of the campaign proceeds?

St. James's participation in the We Are Living Stones Campaign:

Total Campaign Goal: \$607,372

After St. James reaches its *Works of Mercy* target of \$55,000 our parish will receive 50% of every dollar raised up to our Total Campaign Goal of \$607,372 and 60% of every dollar raised over our Total Campaign Goal.

Here at St. James, we have the potential to receive at least \$276,186 if we reach our Total Campaign Goal.

We will use our proceeds to address the following needs:

- Replacing damaged pavers around the exterior of the Church.
- Cleaning the cement floors in the Church.
- Replacing the Church bathroom faucets & installing the hot water heaters.
- Mold removal in the Rectory.
- Remaining funds will go into a general maintenance & ground fund.

Our parish has been generous to our Archdiocese through the Annual Appeal in the past. Please keep in mind as you make your commitment, that the Annual Appeal will <u>not</u> be conducted separately in 2016. However, the Sharing God's Blessings Appeal will return in 2017.

A LETTER FROM A SAINT JAMES PARENT

Why did we choose to send our children to Catholic elementary school and Saint James the Apostle in particular? They could certainly get a great education with caring teachers in our local public schools. To us, however, a Catholic school and Saint James has been much more.
