THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

FROM THE PASTOR

Today we celebrate the Feast of **CORPUS CHRISTI, or THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**. This is the feast of the Eucharist, which Jesus gave to us at the Last Supper. Every time we gather around the Table of the Lord, we are fed and nourished by his Body and Blood. But the Eucharist is more than what we receive. The Eucharist is who we are as God's people, for we gather as the Body of Christ to feed on the Body of Christ. Once we are fed at the Lord's Table, then we are sent forth to live as the Body of Christ. The challenge for us is how to translate into word and action what we have received at the Lord's Table. In other words, how do we live as the Body of Christ, helping to bring the presence of Christ to all we meet?

It is too easy for us to think that all that is required of us is to break bread together and pass the chalice to each other. While this is important for us as the center of our lives, it is just as important to help feed each other by the way we respond to the needs of others. If we fail to live as the Body of Christ, then the effects of celebrating the sacrament are diminished simply because we have failed to live what we believe and what we receive.

In today's Gospel, Jesus multiplies the loaves and fishes to feed the five thousand. The Eucharist does that for us. It feeds us with the Body of Christ, the Bread of Life. But there is another aspect to the miracle of the loaves and fishes. Because the area where Jesus lived was mostly desert, dry and hot, when people traveled they always made sure to take along with them food and water in case they had to stop along the way or need nourishment along the way. In addition to what Jesus did for the crowd, he also invited and encouraged them to share with each other the little food they thought they had. When they opened their sacks and shared with others what they had, there was more than enough for everyone.

Jesus invites us to the Table to be fed and nourished but also invites us to share with others what we have so that there is always more than enough for all of us. After all, we are the Body of Christ, called to live as the Body of Christ, a vibrant sign of Christ's love for us all. This feast also reminds us that it is difficult to live as the Body of Christ without the Eucharist, because the Eucharist is not just the center of our lives as Catholics, but also the primary sacrament of the Catholic Church. It is so easy to dismiss the invitation of Jesus to come to the table because of everything else in which we are involved. The Eucharist is a gift from the Lord and a means of holiness. The invitation is always given to us. It is always our choice whether to accept the invitation or not. Come and see, come and be fed, come and live for us all!

This is also **Memorial Day weekend**, when we remember those men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice so that we could live as a free people. Tomorrow is our Annual Memorial Day Parade. Come and join the Saint James group, or else come and watch as we recognize the heroes and heroines of our families, our parish and our town who died so that we could live and worship as a free people.

THANK YOU TO PAT & FAITH MACDONNELL, who have placed the statue of St. Francis on the front lawn of the rectory. The statue was given to me from a family when I was in Bayonne. I brought it with me when I came here. It is now laced for us to recognize the unique character Francis was for his people and a reminder for us all to care for all of God's creation!

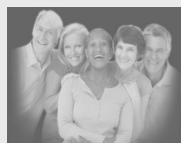

MARY, MICROSOFT AND MEMORIAL DAY

Our Technology teacher, Ms. Zavocki, unofficially dubbed May the month of Mary and Microsoft.

The month of Mary has been both beautiful and reverent. Our 2nd graders received their First Communion, students in Grades K through 8 led the daily recitation of the Rosary and we held our annual May Crowning ceremony on the grounds of our school. Our tradition is for one 8th grade girl to crown Mary and this year it was Kayla Flowers. We added something special by inviting all students to bring in a flower to adorn our Mary statue in Hatcher Hall.

In Technology class, 8th graders were asked to complete a "Desktop Scavenger Hunt" in the Media Center as part of their final technology project as students of Saint James the Apostle School. They were charged with identifying 25 New Jersey state icons, both past and present. Famous New Jersey icons including historic sites, universities, businesses, amusement parks and restaurants were set as the computer desktop screens. Working collaboratively in pairs, the students used computer devices including iPads, Chromebooks and Media Center desktops to see who could name each icon and the town in which the icon was located in a 45 minute class period. Congratulations to Kenneth and Luke, the scavenger hunt winners.

In other Technology classes, students wrote and worked creatively using Microsoft Word and Microsoft Paint. Our 4th graders typed stories about immigration and created a picture to depict what they wrote. They also used Microsoft Paint to depict the phases of the moon. Our 3rd graders typed summaries of a story and illustrated a specific part of the story. Our 2nd graders typed a poem about Mary while our 1st graders creatively typed up their weekly spelling words using various fonts.

We end the month of May with a parish and school march in the Springfield Memorial Day Parade. All parishioner and school families are invited to march together to show the Springfield community how we support and remember those who died while serving in our country's armed forces.
