Reflection on the Readings

A man had a great desire to please God. He prayed day and night and once he heard the voice from above saying: "I want you to go and push that large stone." The man woke up and was so inspired. He ran to find the stone and started pushing it. He pushed and pushed, but nothing happened.

He kept pushing the rock all day long. The next day he did the same, but the stone did not move at all. And for three months the man kept pushing the huge boulder. Finally, he got tired and stopped pushing.


As we continue with Lent, this weekend's readings are meant to help us to persevere in our Lenten journey, as well as life's journey.






FINANCE COUNCIL CORNER
