#### **Reflection on the Readings**

"When you come to spank me, would you bring me a drink of water?"


Kids are cute. But the kid in the story isn't the only person who's thirsty for something!!! What are we looking for this Lent? To get closer to God? To clean up our act? To feel more religious? Or just to lose a few pounds? We have to be frank about our objective, because we're bound to find what we seek. The right answer may also not be what we think it is. We don't have to get closer to God. We can't: God's right here. God dwells in us. Getting closer to God's will might be a better goal, because that alignment is often very far off. If we find ourselves complaining that Lent's not working, that the magic of feeling our religion isn't happening this year, then maybe the answer is to practice a new consciousness. Spend time aware of God in every person you meet and every place you go. Keep searching with your eyes, your mind, your heart. If we practice believing what we profess—that God is in our midst—we may encounter Jesus at the well ourselves.




#### PARISH LIFE UPDATE
