PASTOR'S COLUMN



Liturgical Lesson

Today is Laetare Sunday! On the Fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as Laetare Sunday (Laetare means "rejoice"), we rejoice in the salvation the Lord is giving us as we continue entering into the discipline of Lent. Today is named for the entrance antiphon which sings: "Rejoice, Jerusalem!" We have reached the midway point of our Lenten journey... well done!!! This might be a good time to take stock of how far you've come or how much you've done in your Lenten journey. How have you brought the Lenten practices of

prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to bear over these past weeks?

Reflection on the Readings

Our Gospel scene this Sunday unfolds as Jesus and his disciples are walking through Jerusalem on their way out of the Temple area.

They see a man who is blind, in fact, they learn that he has been blind from birth. There are many points which this story addresses; I'd like to focus on one: Spiritual Blindness.

A man named John was blind. One day someone asked him, 'How did you lose your sight?' 'A chemical explosion,' John said, 'at the age of thirteen.' 'How did that make you feel?' he was asked. 'Life was over. I felt helpless. I hated God,' John responded. 'For the first six months, I did nothing to improve my lot in life. I would eat all my meals alone in my room. One day my father entered my room and said, "John, winter's coming and the storm windows need to be up — that's your job. I want those hung by the time I get back this evening or else!" Then he turned, walked out of the room and slammed the door. "I got so angry," John said. "I thought Who does he think I am? I'm blind!" I was so angry I decided to do it. I felt my way to the garage, found the windows, located the necessary tools, found the ladder, all the while muttering under my breath, "I'll show them. I'll fall, then they'll have a blind and paralyzed son!" John continued, "I got the windows up. Then I found out later that never at any moment was my father more than four or five feet away from my side."

In the same way, Jesus did not promise to spare us the challenges and struggles of life, but he did promise to be with us.

But the reality is that this fact is hard to believe, never mind see!

And that's because we suffer from spiritual blindness.

Like physical blindness, spiritual blindness is also a lack of vision.

It is also the inability to process "light" - the light that emanates from the One who said, "I am the light of the world!" The Gospel account tells us that spiritual blindness is worse than physical blindness.


Friends, my prayer for you is that you may never be blinded to the fact that God is never more than just a few steps away.


SECOND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND:


Black & Indian / Catholic Relief March 18/19, 2023

Mandated by the III Plenary Council in 1884, the 125-year-old National Collection for Black and Indian people continues as the embodiment of the Church's concern for evangelizing the Black and Indian peoples of the United States. The funds are distributed as grants to dioceses throughout the United States, supporting and strengthening evangelization programs which otherwise would cease. The Collection was formerly known as The Black and Indian Home Mission Collection.
