When I arrived at my first assignment as a recently ordained priest nine years ago, the pastor asked me what my goal was as I began ministry as a priest in a parish. I remember my response vividly. I told him that my goal was to learn and experience as much as I could so that one day, I can be a pastor. For me, the vocation of a priest closely resembles that of the vocation of marriage. Ordination to the Priesthood binds the priest to his bride, the Church, that is, the People of God, much like a husband is bound to his wife in love and service. When a priest is called to take on the role of pastor of

a parish, his vocation takes on a radical relationship of love and service to the people he is called to serve, much like when a husband becomes a father. It is in his role as pastor where the title "Father" bursts with new and intense meaning for the priest. To the wonderful people of Saint James the Apostle Church, whom I feel honored and privileged to serve as your Pastor, please know that my heart is filled to the brim with excitement and hope as I am formally installed as the fourteenth pastor of our church.

I feel doubly blessed that the Installation coincides with our parish's Centennial commencement. I pray that these joint celebrations are a providential sign of good things to come. For sure, the Centennial committee has been working hard to make this year of celebration one for the books. Please join us over the next year as we, together, **remember** our past, **celebrate** our faith, and **lead** boldly into the future.

Centennial Capital Campaign Feasibility Study

Lease of the Saint James School Building - Temple Sha'arey Shalom

For the Jewish High Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur this September 25th through the 27th and October 4th and 5th, the parish will be leasing the main floor of the school building to Temple Sha'arey Shalom, a local house of worship. We are pleased to provide a space for Temple Sha'arey Shalom to gather as a community of faith during the holiest of seasons.

The parish is also negotiating with Temple Sha'arey Shalom on a potential yearlong lease of the main floor of the school building. The potential lease will provide a temporary home for Temple Sha'arey Shalom here in Springfield, in addition to providing us with a tenant as we begin the formal process of soliciting proposals for redevelopment of the school and convent properties.

I would like to express my gratitude to God for being sent to St. James. From the bottom of my heart, I feel that I will be very happy serving God and the people of St. James during this year. Please pray for me so that the Lord may strengthen my desire to serve Him and give Him my heart and my whole being daily.

A LISTENING CHURCH: SYNOD UPDATE

The Archdiocese of Newark has announced the release of our Synod on Synodality Synthesis Report, which captures the voices of more than 15,000 people across northern New Jersey. This effort is the local phase of Pope Francis' two-year Synod on Synodality, a worldwide effort to discern how the Catholic Church can better engage with today's faith communities.

More than 700 online and listening sessions were held throughout the four counties of the Archdiocese, and Catholics representing a wide range of cultures, ethnic backgrounds, age groups, and languages contributed. Participants included parishioners, families, parents, students, catechists, and many others — and they expressed their gratitude for the opportunity to participate, as well as their concerns about many key issues facing our Church.

The Synod Report includes recommendations for continuing the synodal journey in the Archdiocese to foster collaboration among all in the faith community as a regular part of Church life. Archdiocesan leaders will use this feedback to forge the synodal path ahead to fortify parishes, ministries, and the local Church.



The 39-page report is available in multiple languages on the Archdiocese's website at www.rcan. org/synod2023. All are encouraged to read the report and prepare questions for ongoing Synod meetings and discussions, which are in the planning stages.

Pope Francis' September Prayer Intention: Abolishment of the Death Penalty

"Let us pray that the death penalty, which attacks the dignity of the human person, may be legally abolished in every country."

Pope Francis goes on to say that the death penalty is "morally inadmissable" because it destroys life, and insists that "up to the very last moment, a person can convert and change". The Pope argues further that "in the light of the Gospel, the death penalty is unacceptable, because the commandment, 'Thou shalt not kill' refers to both the innocent and the guilty."
