Thank you. I love you. And may God bless Saint James the Apostle Church for 100 years more, and beyond.



Centennial Capital Campaign Feasibility Study

Lease of the Saint James School Building - Temple Sha'arey Shalom

For the Jewish High Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur this September 25th through the 27th and October 4th and 5th, the parish will be leasing the main floor of the school building to Temple Sha'arey Shalom, a local house of worship. We are pleased to provide a space for Temple Sha'arey Shalom to gather as a community of faith during the holiest of seasons. The parish is also negotiating with Temple Sha'arey Shalom on a potential year-long lease of the main floor of the school building. The potential lease will provide a temporary home for Temple Sha'arey Shalom here in Springfield, in addition to providing us with a tenant as we begin the formal process of soliciting proposals for redevelopment of the school and convent properties.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN FEASIBILITY FAQ

QUESTION #1. What is the plan for the use of the school and convent buildings?

As previously reported to the parish, a Campus Development Committee of parishioners has been established that is working, in conjunction with the Parish Council and the Finance Council, in seeking proposals from developers to determine the highest and best use of the property to allow the parish to meet its determined objectives. This process is also proceeding in coordination with representatives of the township of Springfield and the assistance of the Office of Property Management Administration of the Archdiocese of Newark.

QUESTION #2. How will the proceeds from a potential lease agreement or property sale be utilized?

Currently the proceeds are intended to have a three-fold purpose, one is to extinguish the approximately \$800,000 parish debt to the Archdiocese, the second is to establish a permanent ongoing revenue source for the parish, and thirdly would be to purchase a residence to serve as the St. James rectory.

QUESTION #3. If the site of the new Parish Community Center is going to be where the rectory currently stands, then where will the rectory be?

Yes, the new Parish center will sit on the footprint of the existing rectory. Where the rectory will be relocated has been a key part of the planning process and will be addressed in the Campus Development Committee plan along with the developer proposals.

QUESTION #4. Will the new Parish Center be connected to the church building?

Currently the new parish center is not designed to be directly connected to the church building but indirectly connected through an extension of the already existent outdoor arcade. The design will provide quick and easy access to the parish center from the church.

QUESTION #5. How will the construction of a new Parish Center impact parking? Will parking be impacted if we sell the school and convent buildings?

As part of the planning for the new Parish Center and the planning for the usage for the school and convent property, parking is proposed to increase by a minimum of 70 spaces.

QUESTION #6. Why don't we renovate the school building and use that as the new Parish Center and move the parish offices in there?

We have explored this option with the Office of Property Management and Administration of the Archdiocese of Newark. The professional consensus is that renovating and repurposing the school building to serve as a parish center and parish offices would not work for the parish to meet its necessary and established objectives. First and foremost, the financial resources required for a total renovation of the school building would be enormous and are well beyond our means. The plan moving forward for the school and convent property, among other things, needs to include the ability to extinguish the debt to the Archdiocese and provide for a means for establishing an ongoing revenue stream for the parish.

Pope Francis' September Prayer Intention: Abolishment of the Death Penalty
