Reflection on the Readings

Today's message brings to bear a human reality - we're always aware of our pain; we're not always aware of our healing.

A child will run to a parent and point to the "boo boo" where she scraped her knee but soon be off to play, the pain forgotten. Adults, too, can be absorbed in the pain of the moment but forget all about it when the pain passes. Which is why, perhaps, the line from this Sunday's gospel is not as

odd as it seems. "One of [the 10 lepers who had been cleansed] realizing he had been healed, returned "

Upon first reading it is interesting how the other lepers didn't realize they were healed. Perhaps it's because we get so comfortable with our maladies that they can become a part of our identity, our sense of self. "I've got a bum knee," I would often say. Then one day my mother noticed, "Your leg hasn't been hurting you for some time now, has it?" I remember when it used to hurt, but I can't remember when it stopped.

Those who have the habit of praying throughout the day, as well as those who pray in times of distress, may be so focused on praying about the next worry or difficulty they may not be aware that yesterday's prayers have been answered.

Friends, this Sunday's readings are about **gratitude.** Why not stop today and try to remember what you were praying about yesterday? You might have some thanking to do.


Centennial Capital Campaign Feasibility Study

Lease of the Saint James School Building - Temple Sha'arey Shalom

The parish has negotiated a 10-month lease with Temple Sha'arey Shalom for the main floor of the school building. The lease will provide a temporary home for Temple Sha'arey Shalom here in Springfield, in addition to providing us with a tenant as we begin the formal process of soliciting proposals for redevelopment of the school and convent properties.



MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

Companionship offers presence rather than solutions.

When someone is experiencing an issue, we tend to want to solve it for them. However, it is important to recognize that being together with someone amid their challenge, having empathy and compassion for their emotions and the space to process the experience together is often more comforting and helpful than coming up with solutions. The art of listening, and truly hearing, is both simple and profound.

October 10th is World Mental Health Day! Throughout the month companionship is the theme for this year's campaign! Having people who journey alongside us through life is a vital aspect of wellbeing. Christians often talk about the importance of community, and we see many examples in the Bible of deep friendship and sacrificial love—models that show us how we are to live together and care for one another.

Companionship can take several different forms:

It can be taking care of her elderly landlady by watering the flowers, and dealing with the recycling, compost, and garbage.

Or a church member who shares a meal with a newly-arrived refugee family.

Calling someone who lives alone or is in a nursing home a call or visit.

Call, visit or email neighbors or family members on a regular bases to keep in touch if you know they are lonely or dealing with problems like depression or grief.

Reach out to someone with anxiety to join a Small Group for The Chosen with you.

There are many other examples that could be listed when it comes to this topic. Companionship is an important topic to us because relationships can play a huge role in recovery for those living with mental health challenges. Relationships help form our identity, and contribute to a sense of belonging. Often, people living with mental health challenges experience social isolation and stigma from others in their communities.

Research has demonstrated the importance of relationships and social support in preventing mental health challenges and promoting mental wellbeing. Communities play a critical role in helping individuals cope with stress and implement recovery plans. (Kawachi, I. and Berkman, L., 2001.)


