





MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

"COME, O FAITHFUL, AND TAKE LIGHT FROM THE LIGHT THAT NEVER FADES; COME AND GLORIFY CHRIST WHO IS RISEN FROM THE DEAD."

A Triduum Sourcebook, II, p. 228

While Holy Week, the Triduum, and Easter were different this year because of COVID-19, at least we were able to have people in church. Last year we were on lockdown, and there were only 4 of us in the church. The Easter services are always meaningful, and I am grateful to all of you who were able to join us in church and on live stream.

The 50-Day Period of Mystagogia gives us an opportunity to reflect more deeply on the resurrection and its impact on our lives. The resurrection has transformed us into a people renewed in hope and new life. This means that we are a different people because Jesus has given us a new perspective on life. As a result, who we are as God's people, what we believe, and what we say and do are supposed to reflect this new life in Jesus.

In today's Gospel, Jesus meets the apostles who are hiding because they think they will also be killed like Jesus. But Thomas needed to see the wounds on Jesus before he would believe. Sometimes we need signs to be convinced that Jesus is present in our lives. It's not that we don't believe, but sometimes we need something more to help us believe better. The Word and the Breaking of the Bread are what can convince us that Jesus is present in life. In addition, sometimes events happen, or people walk into our lives, and that also helps to convince us. Our faith is in a God who has called us all by name, revealed his love for us in Christ Jesus, and calls us to follow the example that Jesus has set for us. Hopefully, the Easter Season will help us as we reflect on the presence of the Risen Christ in life.


Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul.
Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

GENUFLECTION

One way Catholics show respect for the Eucharist, which this year, will be present in the Tabernacle on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, is by genuflecting. The proper way for Catholics to genuflect is by lowering the right knee to the floor and then rising. The left leg should never be used for genuflecting. In addition, when genuflecting, you should be facing the Tabernacle, not the pew you are entering. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the Monstrance, the proper way to genuflect is to bring both knees to the floor (kneel). Those who are not able to genuflect should bow respectfully before the Tabernacle or Monstrance.
