MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

"CHRIST IS RISEN FROM THE DEAD, TRAMPLING DOWN DEATH BY DEATH, AND UPON THOSE IN THE TOMBS BESTOWING LIFE."

An Easter Sourcebook: The Fifty Days, Book Two, p. 1

Today is EASTER! It is the most important day in the life of the church. Today celebrates the rising of Jesus from death. But it also celebrates the new life that restores us to right relationship with God. Easter also reminds us that we are called to celebrate this new life in a variety of ways in our lives. Easter always occurs in the spring, when nature is recreating with flowers and trees that are blooming.

Easter also reminds us that we have been recreated in the image of God and are invited to celebrate this with all we meet. The challenge for us is to live as a people transformed because Jesus offers us new life and resurrection. Even during this pandemic, we have an opportunity to celebrate new life in Jesus by the way we care for each other, responding to one another's needs as a witness to the resurrection.

After the doldrums of this long winter, we are happy to welcome the new life that spring affords us, including the warm weather. This is the new life Jesus has gained for us by his resurrection. But Easter is more than one day. It is a 50 Day Period of Mystagogia, in which we bask in the wonder of resurrection and new life, as we continue to reflect more deeply on the experience of resurrection in our lives and our parish.

Thursday, April 1, is Holy Thursday. There is no morning prayer. Mass of the Lord's Supper is at 7:30PM; it will also be live-streamed. Once the mass is over, the church will be closed. There is no veneration of the Blessed Sacrament that night.

Friday, April 2, is Good Friday. There is no morning prayer. The Good Friday Service is at 3:00PM, and it will be live-streamed. There will be veneration of the cross, but no one is allowed to touch or kiss the cross. You will either genuflect or bow before it. Once the service is over, the church will be closed, and there are no Stations of the Cross that night.

Saturday, April 3, is Holy Saturday. There is no morning prayer. Blessing of food will take place outside of church at 11:00AM. The Easter Vigil is at 7:30PM. Renewal of Baptismal Promises will take place with no sprinkling of Holy Water. The Easter Vigil will be live-streamed. There will be no lighting of the fire before Mass.

Sunday, April 4, is Easter Sunday. The mass schedule is the same as every Sunday, and the 10:30AM mass will be live-streamed. Renewal of Baptismal Promises will take place with no sprinkling of Holy Water.

The church has a limited capacity of 25% occupancy, so I suggest you call the rectory and reserve a place for the services of Palm Sunday, the Triduum, and Easter Sunday. You can also email me at <u>jbarbone546@gmail.com</u>. Masks and social distancing must be maintained.

GENUFLECTION

One way Catholics show respect for the Eucharist, which this year, will be present in the Tabernacle on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, is by genuflecting. The proper way for Catholics to genuflect is by lowering the right knee to the floor and then rising. The left leg should never be used for genuflecting. In addition, when genuflecting, you should be facing the Tabernacle, not the pew you are entering. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the Monstrance, the proper way to genuflect is to bring both knees to the floor (kneel). Those who are not able to genuflect should bow respectfully before the Tabernacle or Monstrance.

Gospel Reflection.....

John 20:1-9

The reality of the resurrection is the central fact of the Christian faith. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Lord gives us "eyes of faith" to know him and the power of his resurrection. The greatest joy we can have is to encounter the living Lord and to know him personally. Do you celebrate the feast of Easter with joy and thanksgiving for the victory which Jesus has won for you over sin and death?








Act of Spiritual Communion

As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.











What is a prayer shawl?

A prayer shawl begins with the shawl maker saying prayers of peace and blessings for the recipient.

The intentions are continued throughout the creation of the shawl.

When a person is given a prayer shawl, it is the hope of the ministery that it will be a reminder of the unconditional love of God and His embrace of each of us during our times of grief, illness, or trial.

May the one who receives this shawl be cradled in hope, kept in joy, graced with peace and wrapped with love.

Shawls can be used for:

- Those undergoing medical procedures
- Those grieving a loss or undergoing a time of stress
- Those who are ill or recovering from illness
- Those who are in need of a tangible reminder of God's love, regardless of situation.
