SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

We begin the Holy Season of Lent on Ash Wednesday. This season is a time the church gives us to look at our relationships with God and each other and to see what we need to strip away to make them better. The ashes we wear on Wednesday are not a social statement but a reminder that we are sinners and in need of redemption. That happened with the death and resurrection of Jesus.

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us that our lives are not about getting even with others but about being a viable and visible sign of his presence for others. It means that our lives are different because of the presence of Jesus within them, and so we are to behave differently with each other. This doesn't mean we can't disagree with others, but that we are called to behave differently because of what Jesus calls us to be as his people. Sometimes, though, when someone says or does something against us, we react against them with words or actions instead of thinking before we say or do something. This is something we can improve upon during Lent. Jesus calls us to holiness and goodness and gives us the opportunity to become better people and better signs of his presence.

There are as many ways to celebrate the presence of Christ in our lives as there are God's people. We must look to the Lord and follow his example. He has shown us how to live with each other, care for one another and help each other discover the wonder that Jesus is for us. As we grow in our relationship with God, our lives are improved and so are the lives of our families and our parish. When we become part of that intimate relationship of Father and Son, we gain a better insight into what that relationship means for us, and how we can reflect that relationship to all we meet and in all the events of our lives. We have to be patient with ourselves, though, as God is patient with us. It's the only way we can come to understand and experience the impact and difference that Jesus makes in our lives. The best thing is that Jesus gives us the rest of our lives to grow in holiness and goodness.

On another page in this bulletin is a message from Matt Wilson informing all of you that he is resigning as Music Minister Director, effective after Mass on Ash Wednesday. In the name of the Parish Staff, all of you, and myself, I want to say "THANK YOU, MATT," for being a part of the life of Saint James, for your service to our parish, enriching our worship with your musical talent and abilities. I wish you well wherever you go to serve the People of God, GOD BLESS YOU!



Dear Family & Friends – It is here! This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and we begin our Lenten Journey! Have we given some thought to what we will do this Lenten Season to grow in our relationship with Christ? Don't worry if your schedules have been busy and there has been little time – it is never too late for Discernment – our topic for today! One often finds the process of discernment difficult because there are times when we tend to make decisions based on the moment's emotions. In particular, when we are on overload, feeling time pressures, and dealing with family issues, it is at those times we tend to choose whatever is easiest at the time.

In your preparation for this Lent, ask the Holy Spirit to assist you in your process. As you pray, try to identify the factors that influence your current decision-making process, e.g., your feelings, your schedule, finances, all of the above? As you think about your Lenten journey and start to discern how you will strengthen your relationship with Our Lord, try to be in touch with your intuition, your current relationship with Our Lord, your personal mission in life (e.g., mother, father, student, grandparent?). In your discernment, think about ways that your commitment will fit into your current responsibilities so you will be able to keep your commitment. Remember, the Lord always understands our difficulties, but we are often not as generous with our self-assessment!

Prayer: Gracious and loving Holy Spirit, help me make sound decisions related to my Lenten journey; Let me be receptive to your guidance and encouragement.

Saint James Students Tackle Real-World Issues Using STEM

Saint James the Apostle School held its 4th annual STEM Fair for students in Grade 7 on February 4, 2020. This STEM Fair model empowers students to see the possibilities of technology and engineering to create a better future. The theme of the STEM Fair is engineering solutions for global sustainable development challenges.

The challenges for the STEM Fair are based on the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of which there are seventeen. Goals include renewable energy, peace and justice, responsible consumption, clean water and sanitation. While developing the project, the teams kept in mind the three pillars of sustainability which are society, economy and the environment. Sustainability is all about providing a better quality of life for all members of society, while building solid economic growth that will have long-term environmental practices.

Under the guidance and leadership of the middle school science teacher, Mrs. Melissa Robbins, students have been working on their problems, processes and solutions while keeping an engineering design notebook since the beginning of the school year. Students presented a tri-fold brochure and prototype to an audience of three (3) judges. This year, our students developed innovative ways to promote good health and well-being, clean water and sanitation, improve life on land and foster industry innovation and infrastructure.

- ◆ **RAM Cookies** *protein cookies* Adin Soto, Emma Jules and Alexandra Morales

There are so many skills that are developed in this process... critical thinking... collaboration... problem solving... communication... creativity. There is also an awareness of gratitude for God's blessings and recognition of the talents bestowed on us to serve and help others. The two projects will advance to the Archdiocese of Newark's STEM Expo which will take place on March 21st at the Youth Retreat Center in Kearny. The overall plan of the STEM Expo is to create an awareness for the Sustainable Development Goals and to empower students to envision possibilities for solutions.

LENTEN INFORMATION

Praying With One Another

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK LENTEN REGULATIONS

1) The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday Night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to Fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2) The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3) The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4) The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 1, 2020 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 7, 2020.

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.
