Thank you for your patience and understanding in the delay in getting the 2021-2022 Registration Form to you. The link to the online registration has been emailed to all families who attended (virtual) classes in 2020-2021. Registration is required yearly, giving families the opportunity to update their email and home addresses as well as provide us with any information that we might need regarding their child's learning needs. If you did not receive the link or were not registered last year, no problem. Please give me a call and I will forward it to you.

Our parish is excited to share with all of the parishioners that this will be our last year of traditional classroom learning. As with most of our surrounding sister parishes, we will only offer Family Faith next year for the 2022-2023 school year. Parents are the primary teachers of their children so it is only fitting that the faith be taught at home along with their cultural heritage and family traditions. There will be more information coming on Family Faith 2022-2023 throughout the year.

The pandemic has really highlighted the family as the domestic church. Pope Francis has placed a special emphasis on forming a synodal church. "A synodal church is a listening church, aware that listening is more than hearing. It is a reciprocal listening in which each one has something to learn." Pope Francis, Oct. 17. 2015. The concept of synodality refers to the involvement and participation of the whole People of God in the life and mission of the Church. The development and strengthening of Family life in the context of a synodal Church.

As we prepare to welcome students and families back in September for our last year of the "traditional" classroom model, we need to be sure we have enough catechists to teach as well as facilitators for our small group, middle school 7th & 8th grade evening gatherings.



Statement from Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., Regarding the Hyde Amendment and the Sanctity of Life



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

I am deeply concerned that the proposed federal budget would eliminate the Hyde Amendment, which, for 45 years, has prohibited the use of federal funds for abortion. The Hyde Amendment is credited with saving the lives of millions of children. Now, the powerful pro-abortion lobby and members of Congress are calling for the elimination of this Amendment and the implementation of a policy that would designate billions of taxpayer dollars for elective abortions. Taxpayer-funded abortion represents a failure to recognize the sanctity of human life and promotes a culture in which human life in its most vulnerable moment is perceived as disposable. Such a proposal targets poor women as needing an expedient solution to a complex problem.

Pope Francis has said, "it is troubling to see how simple and convenient it has become for some to deny the existence of a human life as a solution to problems that can and must be solved for both the mother and her unborn child." He notes that abortion "is not a primarily religious issue but one of human ethics."

It is crucially important that we send a strong, clear message that the Hyde Amendment has far-reaching public support and should not be repealed. Members of Congress need to hear from as many of us as possible. Please read the Action Alerts posted by the New Jersey Catholic Conference at www.njcatholic.org/protecting-the-hyde-amendment, and join me in acting before July 16 to send this urgent message to Congress. 

Saint(s) of the Week......

Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene, July 22.

Mary Magdalene was one of Christ's disciples. She has been identified with several Marys in the Gospel: Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus; Mary, the sinner who washed Jesus' feet with her tears; Mary, a woman who cared for Jesus and his apostles on their journey. Today scholars believe that Mary Magdalene was not the sinful woman in Scripture although she has been confused with this unnamed woman for centuries.

Matthew, Mark, and John record that Mary of Magdala was present at the crucifixion of Jesus and that she was among the women who visited the tomb on Easter morning. Luke mentions her presence only at the tomb on Easter. According to John, Mary was specially privileged to see and speak to the risen Lord on Easter morning. She thought he was the gardener until he said her name.

So Mary Magdalene was near Jesus in his darkest hour and again in his most glorious hour. Moreover, she was an outstanding disciple of Jesus. Because Mary Magdalene was the one who brought the news of Jesus' resurrection to the apostles, she is called the Apostle to the Apostles. For centuries St. Mary Magdalene has been considered a model of complete generosity and of sincere sorrow for sin. She is the patron saint of the contemplative life, converts, glove makers, hairstylists, penitent sinners, people ridiculed for their piety, perfumeries and perfumers, pharmacists, and women.
