# FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend we welcome **CARDINAL JOSEPH TOBIN** to our parish. He is celebrating the 5:00 PM Saturday Mass, as we commemorate the 95th anniversary of our parish and the 65th anniversary of our school. It is always a pleasure and privilege to welcome Cardinal Tobin to Saint James. **WELCOME, BIENVENIDA, BENEVENUTTO, CARDINAL TOBIN!!!** 

During the 95 years of our parish, and 65 years of our school, we have had a number of priests, deacons, religious and lay leaders who have helped us experience the love of God in Christ Jesus. While they may not have been perfect, each one has given us an example of our faith, following the example of Jesus. The readings today remind us of that and challenge us to continue the work that began all those years ago.

We gather as a people of faith each week to listen to the stories of our faith, to break bread together and to accept the challenge to be a sign of Jesus for others. When our parish was founded in 1923, most of this area, and Union County, was farmland. There was no full time pastor until 1925, when Rev. Thomas B. Larkin was assigned as the founding pastor. It took time to build up the parish, and gradually over the years through the efforts of many people we became the parish we are today. Saint James the Apostle Parish stands as a reminder of your faith and a sign of Jesus for all who look to us for a sign of his presence and love.

In the early 1950's, the Archdiocese of Newark built 6 schools, with churches located within, all named after apostles as a means of forming and teaching children the Good News of the Lord. Saint James School was first served by three orders of nuns: the Benedictine Sisters of St. Elizabeth, the School Sisters of Notre Dame, and the Sisters of St. Joseph of Chestnut Hill. After the Josephites left the school, we had lay principals who have continued the mission of formation and education.

As we celebrate the 95th anniversary of our parish, and the 65th anniversary of our school, we begin to look ahead to the 100th anniversary and 70th anniversary in 2023. It is difficult to comprehend the number of people who have been a part of both parish and school, and who experienced the presence of Jesus through all of us who have served here.

The Little Sisters of the Poor, who conducted a collection at the doors of the church a few weeks ago collected \$2,300! They are very grateful for your generosity. **THANK YOU ALL!!!** It's another reason why I am privileged and proud to serve as your pastor!!!

#### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

Our parish Religious Education Program is a partnership between our parish and our parents to support the families in the spiritual development of their children. This partnership works best when we work together, each doing our part to ensure the children are receiving the foundation they need to develop a life-long relationship with Jesus Christ. Together, we are one family, one Body of Christ and a true sign of His presence in our world.

It is our goal to greet each child with an open heart and eagerness to share our love of God with them. We offer the traditional classroom setting (Sunday mornings or Tuesday afternoons), home study (grades 3-7), and our 8<sup>th</sup> graders meet consecutively for two groups of 10 weeks. We also offer individual instruction for children with special needs.

Returning families are reminded, if you haven't already done so, to mail or drop off your 2018-2019 registration form before leaving for vacation! If you are new to our parish or have a child entering 1st grade in September, please call the Religious Education Office for information about registering as a parishioner and / or registering your child(ren) for classes. Baptism Certificates are needed at the time of registration. Kindergarten Classes, while optional, are offered only on Sunday mornings.

Ann Marie Gesualdo, the 8th Grade Program / Confirmation Coordinator will be emailing the parents of incoming 8th graders with details about the 8th grade program for the Fall. She will also communicate with the parish school 8th grade families before classes begin in September.

If your child is preparing to receive any of the sacraments and he /she attends Saint James the Apostle School and you are Catholic, but not registered parishioners, please call / email me.

Do you have a child who was baptized but has not been prepared to received the Sacraments of Communion and/or Confirmation?



#### **MARRIAGE**

Couples planning to marry are asked to call the Parish Office at least one year prior to their desired date so that arrangements can be made.
