TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM THE PASTOR

Today we begin the Sundays of Ordinary Time, which, with the exception of the Feast of John the Baptist on the 24th, will carry us up to the beginning of Advent. Ordinary Time is a time in between seasons, but is also a season of its own. The Gospels of Mark and John will reflect the public ministry of Jesus. They remind us of the care that Jesus showed to the people he met, as a reflection of the Father's love for them.

But now this ministry falls to all of us by virtue of our baptism. While each of us responds to the call of the Lord differently, each of us still has the responsibility to reflect the presence of Jesus in our lives to those we meet each day.

As the sign of Jesus on earth, the church, in its ministry, shows the world the care and concern it has for the people of God. In many places in the world, this ministry occurs in difficult and sometimes dangerous places. Yet, the clergy, religious and lay workers, are committed to the care of the Lord's people, in response to their call by the Lord. Sometimes, because we are located in a particular town and a particular parish, we tend to overlook all of this. We may know that the church is world-wide, but it is so easy to block out the fact that there are some who minister in distant and difficult places.

Today's Gospel is about authenticity. Jesus calls us to be authentic, credible and faithful witnesses to the Good News. He challenges us to allow the Gospel to permeate our being so that we reflect it in who we are and in what we say and do. The result then is that we are able to use the gifts we are and have for the good of others, thus helping to build the kingdom of God on earth. This requires all of us who claim to be followers of Jesus. It is not a question of how much we do or how little, but that we respond to the call of the Lord in faith so that others may know and believe what we know and believe, that Jesus died and rose for all of us.

While this time of year is one of relaxation from the normal routines of life, we can never relax or take for granted our responsibility to be a visible sign of Jesus Christ for others. There also comes a great deal of satisfaction, knowing that we may have helped another person experience the presence of Christ through us!

Last Saturday, we celebrated the Feast of Madonna Della Carmine with Mass in Italian. We usually celebrate this feast on the last Saturday of May, but because of Joe Furnaguera's ordination, we transferred it to last week. In celebration of the feast, \$83 was collected and given to the church.



All volunteers for overnight stays <u>must</u> have current Protecting God's Children Training and agree to a background check (this is <u>not</u> a credit check).


