NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

FROM THE PASTOR

Today we celebrate the Birth of John the Baptist. Even though John was the cousin of Jesus, he really didn't know him since he had been living in the desert. It wasn't until he appeared for the baptism of Jesus that this may have been the first encounter between them.

But, John was an interesting character. He knew what his mission was all about. He didn't have an ego problem. He was to prepare the way of the Lord, telling the people about the one coming after him. Then, when Jesus appeared and after his baptism, John returned to the desert. Because he lived with this extreme community called the Essenes, he looked differently than most people, and even spoke differently. At first, it was difficult for some to grasp his message, but they eventually did. Yet, his message and his mission live on for us today.

The mission of John falls to each of us. We are to prepare the way for the day the Lord returns again, all the while celebrating the Lord's presence here and now. But sometimes we get in the way of this mission. We can easily forget that the mission of the Lord's presence is not about us. It is about him. He is the one who sends us forth to be the Good News for others. We are the instruments that the Lord uses to let others know about this incredible story of God's love for us all. We can get so caught up in ourselves that we can lose sight of the fact that it is the Lord who calls us as his own, sends us forth as ambassadors of his presence, and through the guidance of the Holy Spirit we are able to accomplish our work. This is about God's Kingdom on earth and not our own.

We may feel at times that this is too difficult, especially when we encounter people who may not like us or who may not want to hear about the Good News as it is reflected in our lives. But that only makes our work more important and more serious. Jesus lived, died and rose for all of us, not just for a select group of people. Our response to others must reflect what our faith in God is about so that they will see in us the love and presence of a God who cares for all of us. Imagine if John had decided to stay in the desert or return as soon as he was criticized for one reason or another. Fortunately for all of us, he chose to accept the challenge and responsibility for which God called him. Hopefully, we are able to do the same.

On Wednesday, June 13, we celebrated the Feast of St. Anthony with a Mass in Italian. In celebration of the feast, \$186 was collected and given to the church **GRAZIE, TUTTI ITALIANI!!!**

Chippy's Grand Tour

First Graders read <u>Skippy ChipMunk's Birthday</u> <u>Surprise!</u>, written by Susan Scarince Jones. This book encourages children to take a closer look at the world around them. After learning about habitats in Mrs. West's classroom, the students decided that their class chipmunk, Chippy, should take a closer look and visit each habitat. This is how the idea of Chippy's Grand Tour got started. How will Chippy travel to the habitats?

In Mrs. Burns' art room, students brainstormed transportation ideas for Chippy, then they created vehicles for his travels using cardboard, paint, tape, etc. The vehicles included a plane, a pizza delivery car, a canoe, a snowmobile, a boat, a submarine, and a hot air balloon. In the art room, students constructed, papier-mâchéd, and painted the vehicles. (Maybe you remember seeing the vehicles on display at our Spring Art Show.) Next, they drew and colored the backgrounds and designed the habitats for each photo shoot. Each student wrote their own page for the book and then they peer edited their pages as a class.

The pages were written and edited, in class with Mrs. West. Then, with the help of Ms. Zavocki in the Media Center, the young authors worked on their typing skills and typed their page of the story book!

Mrs. Burns was inspired to have the book published and each student received their own copy. When the books arrived, Mrs. Burns read the book to the class with Mrs. West, Ms. Zavocki and Mrs. Ponterio in attendance. The class gave a copy to the Principal who requested each student sign it so she could proudly display her autographed copy, courtesy of our young authors/illustrators/ set designers... the First Grade.

A special thank you to Mrs. West (Grade 1 teacher), Ms. Zavocki (Technology teacher) and Mrs. Burns (Art teacher) for inspiring the children to learn, write, construct, illustrate, and read. These teachers went above and beyond with this project!


