THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

"ALMIGHTY AND ETERNAL GOD, WHO DREW OUT A FOUNTAIN OF LIVING WATER IN THE DESERT FOR YOUR PEOPLE - AS THEY WELL KNEW - DRAW FROM THE HARDNESS OF OUR HEARTS TEARS OF COMPUNCTION, THAT WE MAY BE ABLE TO LAMENT OUR SINS AND MAY MERIT TO RECEIVE YOU IN YOUR MERCY."

A Lent Sourcebook: The Forty Days, Book One, p. 201

Water is a vital element in our existence. We need water to live. Yet, as important as water is for us, sometimes it is a destructive force in our world. Consider the many floods we have read and heard about recently, especially with climate change occurring in our world. It is important that we hydrate so that we can maintain our balance in life. Hydration is even more important for the elderly because too many of them don't drink enough water which only creates more problems.

In today's Gospel, Jesus meets a woman seeking water from a well, who does not know that her life will be radically changed because of her encounter with Jesus. She was a Samaritan and an outcast to the Hebrews. Because of her standing in society, she thought that she could get to the well in the heat of the day, get the water she needed and leave. Most people would gather at the well in the evening, when it was cooler. They would not just gather to get water, but also to socialize, much like we do today around kitchen and other tables.

The woman's encounter with Jesus meant that she met the person who would give her life-giving water. His presence assured her that Jesus didn't make a distinction between one person or another. Neither does he with any of us. He offers us his life-giving water expressed by his love and presence in our lives. The more we receive from him, the more we need to return and seek more. Our thirst and our need for him is never satisfied. This is because Jesus offers us the new life of the Father, for which he died to save us all and rose again to restore us to right relationship with the Father.

Lent is always a good time for us to consider our continuing need for Jesus and his life giving presence that sustains, nurtures and nourishes us, and invites us to return again and again. This is also a good time to consider our thirst for him, and that without his presence in our lives, it is difficult to live as his followers. We may need to draw water to help keep us alive, but the life-giving presence of Jesus is constantly there for us. All we have to do is keep tapping into him so that we may be able to continue to be his Good News to others.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK LENTEN REGULATIONS

1) The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday Night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to Fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2) The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3) The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4) The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 1, 2020 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 7, 2020.

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.
