

The Ascension of the Lord ~ May 24, 2020

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

"YOU SHALL BE CALLED BY A NEW NAME PRONOUNCED BY THE MOUTH OF THE LORD. YOU SHALL BE A GLORIOUS CROWN IN THE HAND OF THE LORD, A ROYAL DIADEM HELD BY YOUR GOD"

An Easter Sourcebook, p. 124

Today is the **FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD!** Cardinal Tobin has transferred the feast to today since we could not celebrate it on May 21.

The apostles had enough of a problem trying to deal with the death of Jesus. His resurrection restored their hope, at least for a while. But the Ascension may have confused them again since they saw Jesus permanently leave their presence. Of course, this will all change with the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

In today's readings, the apostles are reassured that Jesus will return to them, not in a physical way but in a spiritual one. Matthew reminds us that Jesus will not abandon the apostles but will always be with them. Maybe this was too much for the apostles to handle. After all, most were fishermen and not theologians. But eventually, they got it! The rest, as they say, is history.

Sometimes, we may feel that the Lord has abandoned us. During this time of Covid-19, there are some who feel we are being tested by God, and that God has caused all of this to happen. Whatever the reason for Covid-19, the pandemic has shown us how to live, work and learn differently. It has shown us that we have to watch out for each other in a way that is different than before. But it has also brought us to a better approach to God, who did not abandon us but gave us his Son and the Spirit. The most difficult issue for us during this pandemic is that we cannot gather in church to celebrate the Eucharist. Yet, God is present in our prayer life and in our care for one another. Hopefully, we will soon be able to gather together again in church as a community, with the changes required by Cardinal Tobin.

While Cardinal Tobin has allowed churches in the archdiocese to open for private prayer, I cannot open our church right now until all the directives required of us are put in place. These include cleaning and sanitizing the church, the availability of hand sanitizers and the re-configuration of the church for social distancing. Hopefully, all of this will be accomplished relatively soon. I ask your patience, as I have to comply with all the directives. If you have read or heard that Saint James Church is open, it is not true. You will be notified when the church reopens.

As you already know, our Parish Festival, which is usually held the last week of April, had to be postponed because of Covid-19. I want to tell you that the new dates are Tuesday, October 13 through Saturday, October 17. Hopefully, we will have good weather. Please make plans to join us.

I also want to announce that two of our staff members, Ann Marie Gesualdo and Karen Cocco, have resigned as members of the parish staff. There are a number of reasons for their departure. In the name of all of us, I want to thank **ANN MARIE & KAREN**, for sharing their expertise and their ministry with our parish, especially our young people and religious education families. I pray that God will continue to bless them, no matter what they do in his name. **GOD BLESS YOU, ANN MARIE & KAREN!**

FIRST READING: ACTS 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with the them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority.

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you,

and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going,

suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them.

They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?

This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven

will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."

Gospel Reflection: Paul the Apostle reminds us that we are called to be ambassadors for Jesus Christ. Just as ambassadors are appointed to represent their country and to speak on behalf of their nation's ruler, we, too are appointed by the Lord Jesus to speak on his behalf and to bring others into a close and personal encounter with the Lord and Ruler of heaven and earth. This is the great commission which the risen Christ gives to the whole church. All believers have been given a share in this task - to be heralds of the good news and ambassadors for Jesus Christ, the only savior of the world. We have not been left alone in this task, for the risen Lord works in and through us by the power of his Holy Spirit. Today we witness a new Pentecost as the Lord pours out his Holy Spirit upon his people to renew and strengthen the body of Christ and to equip it for effective ministry and mission world-wide. Do you witness to others the joy of the Gospel and the hope of the resurrection?

God calls each of us to do His work here on earth. Some are called to work in the Lord's vineyard, some are called to vocations in the field of education, health care, labor, etc. The list goes on and on. Each of us brings a gift to that vocation that is supposed to be shared with others. That is how we learn and grow as individuals. Sometimes though, God calls us towards a different path, and we sometimes don't exactly know where that path will lead us.

If you have already read Fr. Joe's Message, then you know that Karen Cocco and Ann Marie Gesualdo will be leaving their positions within the Office of Religious Education. I have had the privilege of learning and growing in my ministry and my own personal faith journey because of the gifts that Karen and Ann Marie have shared with me, and your children as well. As a parishioner, Karen will remain active in parish events and help our in various faith formation programs. Ann Marie has agreed to continue with this year's 8th grade class to prepare them for the Sacrament of Confirmation as well as helping out when we need it. I know that God brings people into our lives for a reason, and for that reason, I know that our journey with Karen and Ann Marie is not over. It's taking a different path.

As Cardinal Tobin announced the three phases to reopening the churches, I am hopeful that we will be hearing news of how and when we can offer masses to celebrate the Sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation. I promise that as soon as I receive information from the archdiocese, the sacramental families will be the first to know and our masses will be rescheduled when it is safe for our parish to do so.

In the meanwhile, I encourage all families, but especially those with children preparing for the Sacrament of First Eucharist, to continue attending our virtual Sunday morning mass on either YouTube or Facebook at 10:30AM. This is a great opportunity to answer your child's questions during the actual mass without worrying about disturbing anyone sitting around you. Participating in virtual mass will also reinforce the prayers that we recite and help the children to acclimate themselves when we are reunited in church again.

As we continue to discover new ways of sharing our faith, we are also working with the Archdiocese to find ways to continue to catechize our children should school look different in the Fall.

Any family new to our program or with a child entering 1st grade (Kindergarten is optional) please email me so we can arrange to speak. Baptismal certificates are required for all new students regardless of grade at the time of registration.






