

Today is MOTHER'S DAY! It is the one day we recognize the gift of our mother. But we should do that every day!

We were formed by the love of our mother and father, who nurtured us and guided us as best as they could. They brought us to faith by their faith through the waters of baptism. Because of this event, we are connected to the church, nurtured by Word and Sacrament, and called to live a life that reflects the presence of Christ.

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are in the Blessed Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I long for You in my soul.
Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
As though You have already come, I embrace You and unite myself entirely to You; never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

GENUFLECTION

One way Catholics show respect for the Eucharist is by genuflecting. The proper way for Catholics to genuflect is by lowering the right knee to the floor and then rising. The left leg should never be used for genuflecting. In addition, when genuflecting, you should be facing the Tabernacle, not the pew you are entering. When the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in the Monstrance, the proper way to genuflect is to bring both knees to the floor (kneel). Those who are not able to genuflect should bow respectfully before the Tabernacle or Monstrance.







DECREE

In consultation with the four Diocesan Bishops of the New Jersey Ecclesiastical Province and receiving their unanimous approval; following the complimentary norms set forth by Pope John Paul II; desiring to provide for the pastoral needs of the Archdiocese of Newark, Diocese of Paterson, Metuchen, Trenton, and Camden; and conscious of the cautions and restrictions resulting from the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, we have decided to transfer the celebration of the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord from Thursday, May 13, 2021 to Sunday, May 16, 2021. Therefore, by virtue of my authority as diocesan bishop (canons 87, §1 and 1245), I decree that the liturgical celebration and the obligations of the holy day, the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, are transferred to the following Sunday, the Seventh Sunday of Easter, May 16, 2021.
