

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Leprosy is not only a contagious disease, it also deforms the leper. It is not a disease that one gets and is cured with medication. It's a lifelong disease. Damien of Molokai is the most famous Catholic Saint who was sent to minister to the lepers on Molokai. During his ministry, he contracted the disease and eventually died on Molokai. He is a reminder of the church's mission to reach out to all in order to bring them the Good News of Jesus.

Part of the church's ministry is that of healing. It is an expression of the gentle touch of the Lord who brings his healing to all of us. Some of us need a reminder that Jesus is the one who heals us and make us whole. Others need something more that expresses the church's healing ministry. The church provides the Sacrament of the Sick for those who are physically, mentally, or emotionally sick. The oil used is blessed by Cardinal Tobin every Holy Week at the Chrism Mass and distributed to all the churches for their use. Sometimes anointing of the sick takes place at a Mass of Healing. Most of the time, it happens when individuals are hospitalized and anointed because they are sick or prior to an operation. It may also occur in a person's home when the priest visits the homebound and anoints the individual because of the seriousness of the illness that keeps them home. Whatever the circumstance, it reminds us that Jesus is the Healer, and he is the one who can make us whole. He may not be able to cure one's physical, emotional or mental condition, but he does reassure us of his healing presence in our lives.

The healing ministry of the church is never to be taken lightly or dismissed because it doesn't always cure people. The Sacrament of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments of the church meant to express the love and care of God's people. The sacraments are not magic. One doesn't wave a hand and all is made well. They are experiences and encounters with the Lord Jesus who offers us the loving presence of the Father for us all. It is this presence which can heal us, make us whole and remind us that we can also be agents of healing. This happens when we touch each other with the presence of the Lord, who always calls us to holiness and goodness.

On Thursday, October 3, we celebrated the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi with a Mass in Italian. In celebration of the feast **\$40** was collected and given to the church. **GRAZIE**, **TUTTI!!!**

On Saturday, October 5, at 12:00 Noon, we celebrated St. Francis with the blessing of animals. While most of the animals were dogs, there also were two cats and a rabbit. Francis taught us to care for the earth and all its inhabitants, including the animals. He was the first ecologist!

Tomorrow is Columbus Day, which is always celebrated on the second Monday in October. It was Columbus who brought the Catholic faith to the Americas. Some towns have changed the name of the day to the Indigenous Peoples Day. While Columbus may have created some problems when he arrived, he still brought his heritage, Genoese, his Catholic faith, and his cultural traditions to the new world. There may be some who want to look for problems that all explorers created when they arrived on our shores and the shores of other countries. But the explorers had a vision, and that is what led them to accomplish their goals. Let us celebrate them and not denigrate them.

Today's Gospel Meditation......

Luke 17:11-19

Why did only one leper out of ten return to show gratitude? Gratefulness, another word which expresses gratitude of heart and a thankful disposition, is related to grace - which means the release of loveliness. Gratitude is the homage of the heart which responds with graciousness in expressing an act of thanksgiving. The Samaritan approached Jesus reverently and gave praise to God.

If we do not recognize and appreciate the mercy and help shown to us we will be ungrateful and unkind towards others. Ingratitude is forgetfulness or a poor return for kindness received. Ingratitude easily leads to lack of charity and intolerance towards others, as well as to other vices, such as complaining, grumbling, discontentment, pride, and presumption. How often have we been ungrateful to our parents, pastors, teachers, and neighbors? Do you express gratitude to God for his abundant help and mercy towards you and are you gracious, kind, and merciful towards your neighbor in their time of need and support?

"Lord Jesus, may I never fail to recognize your loving kindness and mercy towards me. Fill my heart with compassion and thanksgiving, and free me from ingratitude and discontentment. Help me to count my blessings with a grateful heart and to give thanks in all circumstances."



What do Altar Servers do During Mass?
