

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

This coming Saturday, November 2nd, we once again welcome Bishop Manny Cruz, Vicar of Union County, to our parish as the confirming bishop. He will celebrate the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Confirmation for our young people. **BIENVENIDA**, **BISHOP MANNY!!!**

CONGRATULATIONS to our young people celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation on Saturday. As they grow in the grace and wisdom of the sacrament, may they also be good examples to all of us of the presence of Jesus in their lives.

In today's Gospel, the familiar story of the Pharisee and tax collector is proclaimed.


The Pharisees were the leaders of the temple, and they became so ingratiated with themselves that everyone else was looked down upon. They were arrogant and self-righteous and believed that they were better than everyone else, especially tax collectors. On the other hand, the tax collectors were seen as enemies of Israel because they worked for the force occupying their country, the Romans. In addition, they made money not just collecting taxes, by taking bribes, which made them wealthy. Yet, it was the tax collector who stood humbly before God seeking his mercy.

While we recognize that we are all sinners, it is easy to fall into the trap that because of our faith in God we deserve his mercy, love and forgiveness. God's love is freely given to us, not because we deserve it but because of his generosity and care for us. His love, as expressed in Christ Jesus, is a call to holiness and goodness, and is meant to be reflected in who we are as his people and how we should live. In revealing the secrets of his heart to us, Jesus has invited us to help make the kingdom of God a reality for all we meet. These are the qualities of the kingdom: justice, mercy, compassion, equality and forgiveness. If we want to be credible witnesses of Jesus, then these qualities have to be a part of who we are and how we live. We have to be able to recognize that we are all equal to the task of working for the kingdom, and there is no discrimination of any sort in our efforts.

We all stand under the power of the Word and because of this, the Word must permeate our being so that it is reflected in everything we say and do. This is how the kingdom of God is built on earth by the efforts of all of us willing to listen and learn from the Master. No one is better than the other in helping build the kingdom because we are all connected to each other by virtue of our baptism and our relationship to Christ.

Today's Gospel Meditation......

Luke18:9-14

This parable presents both an opportunity and a warning. Pride leads to self-deception and spiritual blindness. True humility helps us to see ourselves as we really are in God's eyes and it inclines us to seek God's help and mercy. God dwells with the humble of heart who recognize their own sinfulness and who acknowledge God's mercy and saving grace. God cannot hear us if we boast in ourselves and despise others. Do you humbly seek God's mercy and do you show mercy to others, especially those you find difficult to love and to forgive? "Lord Jesus, where I lack charity, kindness, and forbearance, help me to seek the good of my neighbor, even those who cause me ill-favor or offense. May I always love as you love and forgive others as you have forgiven."

Kindergarten Happenings.....

At Saint James the Apostle, Kindergarten has been immersed in the season of fall. Mrs. Hiel's Kindergarten class has been studying about the parts of an apple and the life cycle of a pumpkin. Using their five senses, they have taken nature walks and written about what they see, hear, smell, touch and taste. Their art projects feature what they have the collected on their walks and the students even made yummy fall snacks like applesauce.

Kindergartners love to count! The class predicted how many seeds were in their pumpkin after Mrs. Hiel cut off the top and emptied out the pulp. They counted up to 270! Their pumpkin investigation was messy, but so much fun! They are using ten frames and Halloween erasers to practice counting. They are also learning how to sort, recognize and create patterns using the fall items collected, like pine cones, leaves, and acorns.

Kindergartners are practicing beginning sounds and sight words and yes, beginning to recognize those words...which means they are reading! Kindergartners love books!

Last week, the class enjoyed a literature-based STEM challenge. They began with a 5 *Little Pumpkins* story. After listening to the story about the pumpkins on the gate, they were challenged to build a gate or fence to hold up five pumpkins. Students were excited to try. For pumpkins, they used recycled orange tops from squeezable-fruit pouches. Building materials for the gate included clothespins, craft sticks, toilet-paper rolls, LEGO® bricks, and tongue depressors.

The children worked in small groups to create, test and then improve on their structures. They were creative and determined and SUCCESSFUL! Great job, budding engineers!

Saint James the Apostle Parish is looking for students in Grades 3-8 who have received their First Holy Communion and are interested in serving at the Altar during Mass.

What do Altar Servers do During Mass?

- Serve as the cross bearer, candle bearer and/or book bearer
- Assist deacon or priest with setting up the altar and receiving gifts
- Perform other duties such as carrying the incense, etc.

Altar Servers serve at the Saturday evening or Sunday weekly Masses and special Holy Days. Servers are scheduled approximately one weekend every 3 or 4 weeks, as needed. Altar Servers are usually scheduled to serve at their family's preferred weekly Mass to make serving easily fit into the family schedule. Saint James the Apostle students also serve at monthly school Masses. Altar serving is also a great way for 7th and 8th grade Confirmation Candidates to earn service hours!



HOSPITAL VISITATIONS


