

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

There are a lot of words coming out of Washington regarding the Impeachment Inquiry into the president's conversation with a foreign leader. Impeachment is never an easy decision because it affects not just the president but the country as well. Sometimes it's hard to know whom or what to believe, but hopefully the truth will ultimately prevail. It'll be interesting to follow this whole procedure. Regardless of what party one is affiliated with, as the discussions continue, hopefully all of this will be resolved.

In today's Gospel, the apostles are asking Jesus to increase their faith. It is never as easy as it sounds. Faith is increased when we are willing to enter into dialogue with the Father, and allow his presence to touch and transform us. This is not about a quantitative relationship, but a qualitative one, which cannot be measured. It is like our relationships with each other. Our relationships are not measured by how much we talk to each other, but by how willing to explore the unique person each one is for the other. It works the same way with God. We have to be willing to listen with our heart as Jesus reveals the secrets of his heart to us and to express this in the way we pray and live our lives. It's not about how many prayers we say, although prayer is always important, but how willing we are to be transformed by his presence in our lives.

In last week's bulletin, Caroline Ponterio, the Principal of Saint James School, mentioned a new addition to our campus, the outdoor classroom. This classroom was planned and developed by one of our parishioners, and an alumnus of Saint James School, John McElroy. This project was the fulfillment of John's Eagle Scout Service Project. The classroom was dedicated by Caroline on Thursday, September 19, 2019 and has already been used by one of the teachers and her class. I had the honor of blessing the outdoor classroom on Saturday, September 28, 2019, after the 8:00AM Mass. I invited the parishioners who were present at the Mass to join in the blessing. **THANK YOU, JOHN, for sharing your gifts and talents with the Saint James Community. May the outdoor classroom be used by many Saint James School students for many, many years to come!**



Today's Gospel Meditation......

Luke 17:5-10

How strong is your faith in God and how can you grow in it? Faith is not something vague, uncertain, undefinable, or something which requires a leap of the imagination or worse, some kind of blind allegiance. In fact, it is quite the opposite. Faith is a response of trust and belief in what is reliable, truthful, certain, and real. To have faith is to believe and trust in someone or something. We believe in the power of electricity even though we can't visibly see it with the naked eye. We know we can tap into that power and use it to do things we could not do by our own human power. Faith in God works in a similar way.

Jesus used this parable of the dutiful servant to explain that we can never put God in our debt or make the claim that God owes us something. God expects us to serve him willingly and give him the worship, praise, and honor which is his due.

What's Happening with the Class of 2020?

Saint James the Apostle School is very proud of our 8th graders who continue to embody the values of our school as they represent us in the community, and here in the parish. In October, they will represent our school at the Roselle Catholic High School's Forty-Eighth Annual Scholastic Olympics, an academic competition designed to encourage and stimulate educational interest and ability in our youth.

The wall outside the School Office is filled with posters and information about upcoming Open Houses at area high schools. The 7th and 8th graders spent the morning of September 30th meeting admissions directors and students from 12 high schools who were invited over the summer to come and speak to our students. After months of preparation, the entire eighth grade will take the COOP test on Friday, November 8. This test is taken by all students – from Catholic, private and public schools who are interested in attending an archdiocesan high school. The high schools use the results to make decisions about admission, scholarships and advanced placement.

In the classroom, the eighth graders look forward each week to "Monday's with Father Joe," when Father Joe teaches them religion. The students especially enjoy his faith stories and his "question of the day" which relates faith to everyday eighth-grade life. The class is also reading *Warriors Don't Cry*, a memoir by Melba Pattillo Beals, detailing the integration of Little Rock's Central High School following the landmark **Supreme Court** decision of **Brown v. Board of Education**. We will follow this up by seeing a one-woman play dramatizing this book at Kean University in January.

We are so proud of our eighth graders! They have seamlessly taken on their leadership role in our school and are grateful to have the opportunity to share their accomplishments and goals with the entire parish! God bless!

What do Altar Servers do During Mass?




