

FROM THE PASTOR

Watching the news of the continuing destructive force of Hurricane Harvey brought back memories of Super storm Sandy. We were all affected by Sandy in more ways than one, but Harvey brought more continuous rain than anyone expected. Harvey also brought back memories of Hurricane Katrina and Floyd, and the incredible destructive power of too much water.

When hurricane Floyd struck this area in 1999, one of the hardest hit areas was Bound Brook. I went there a few times not just to see the destruction, but also to determine how our parish could help a family who lost pretty much everything. Seeing the water lines in the houses, and smelling wet wall board and bleach only reminded me of what the people of Houston are experiencing as they go back to their homes to try to salvage whatever they can. The response to this storm has been incredible, as it is in most storms like this. People are always willing to help, no matter what, because it's part of the human psyche. There will be a second collection next weekend for the victims of Hurricane Harvey, and the monies collected will be sent to the archdiocese and probably given to Catholic Charities.

This week school begins at Saint James and in Springfield. As the new school year begins, it is always a good sign to see the children return with an eagerness and willingness to learn. **Reminder:** as you drive around town and the area, please be aware of the school buses and the children walking to school. We want to keep them all safe for the new adventures that await them this year.

Tomorrow is the 16th anniversary of the horrific events of 9/11 (2001). We all know where we were and what we were doing when the Twin Towers were struck by the two planes. As far as we have come in these 16 years, the memory still tells us it was yesterday. I was celebrating 8:45 am mass in Bayonne when the first plane struck the tower, and didn't find out what happened until I returned to the rectory and the secretary told me. I went upstairs and put the television on, and then saw the second plane strike the other tower. Then I went to church and tolled the bells all day in memory of all those who were killed.

There are a number of Memorial Services tomorrow. As I have done for the past number of years, I will lead the Memorial Service in Bayonne, at the Teardrop Memorial at Harborview Park. Eleven citizens from Bayonne died in the planes, two of whom I knew. It's always a touching service, especially as the names of the Bayonne residents are read.

Harvey and 9/11. Two different experiences and yet both remind us of the frailty of human life and the need to be vigilant and to care for one another.

A PEACEFUL 9/11!!



Meet our 7th grader, Jack Chacon... son, brother, student, athlete, friend. These are just some of the words you could use to describe Jack. Jack is also an advocate. Jack has Hereditary Angio Edema (HAE). HAE is a very rare and potentially life-threatening blood disorder that occurs in 1 in 50,000 people. Over the last few years, Jack has successfully raised over \$25,000 for the Hereditary Angio Edema Association. In January, Jack hosted a movie screening of "Special Blood", a documentary about four patients living with this disorder who learn to find strength in each other and their small, but strong community. Earlier this year Jack was appointed to the HAEA Youth Leadership Council providing him the opportunity to advance and share his advocacy efforts. In July, Jack spent a day on Capitol Hill meeting and speaking with the health care aids for the NJ, NY, PA & MA Senators and Representatives, emphasizing how their choices greatly affect children and their families. In August, he spent his 12th birthday abroad in Germany at an International Youth Camp for HAE patients and was invited to Vienna for an international conference next Spring!

On September 16th, Jack will be speaking at an HAE Patient Summit in Minneapolis, Minnesota. On Saturday, September 23rd at 8:00 am, TEAM JACK is hosting an HAE IN-MOTION® 5K event at Nomahegan Park in Cranford to benefit HAEA. HAEA's overall commitment to improving the lives of HAE patients centers around its three fundamental pillars:

- 1. The increasing momentum in their research efforts.
- 2. The mile markers crossed in realizing treatments to help HAE patients lead normal lives.
- 3. The strides toward finding a cure.

Fatima for Today

Fr. Andrew Apostoli, C.F.R.

Though the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima took place almost a hundred years ago, Our Lady's call to prayer and penance for the salvation of souls and peace in the world is as relevant now as when first delivered to three Portuguese peasant children in 1917.

At the peak of World War I, Our Lady warned us of another possible worldwide conflict, the rise and spread of Communism, and a terrible persecution of the Church, unless people repented of their sins and returned to God. She also requested devotion to her Immaculate Heart and a special consecration of Russia.

Much of what Our Lady of Fatima said was revealed soon after her appearances, but the third and final "secret," which was not a message but a prophetic vision seen by the children, was not unveiled by the Vatican until 2000. Pope John Paul II, who read the third secret while recovering from the attempt upon his life in 1981, believed the vision signified the sufferings the Church had endured in the twentieth

Because of the prophetic nature of her messages, the story of Our Lady of Fatima has been the subject of much controversy and speculation. In his book, Fr. Andrew Apostoli, an acclaimed expert on Fatima, carefully analyzes the events and messages at Fatima and clears up lingering questions and doubts about their meaning. He also challenges the reader to hear anew the call of Our Lady to prayer and sacrifice, for the world is ever in need of generous hearts willing to make reparation for those in danger of losing their way to God.
