MESSAGE FROM THE PAROCHIAL VICAR

Canon Law 1004:

"The anointing of the sick can be administered to a member of the faithful who, after having reached the use of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age."

Do you find joy in music and want to minister to God with sung prayer? The choirs at Saint James are welcoming new members to join our music ministry and serve God and our parish with the gift of music. Sharing the gift of music through ministry facilitates a genuine engagement with the liturgy, promotes us to work collectively to produce something gratifying, and heightens the worship within the parish community that is Saint James. Music is extraordinarily powerful, and our goal is to use music as a vehicle to stimulate our vulnerability to God. We share our service of faith with you, and now we call on you to join our ministry of service.

Our adult and high school choirs rehearse weekly on Wednesday evenings from 7:30PM to about 8:45PM. They sing weekly at the 10:30AM Mass and occasionally at the 5:00PM, in addition to high feast days. The first rehearsal will take place on September 18th. Our children's choir rehearses on Thursdays from 3:00-4:00PM and sings once a month at the 12:00 noon Mass, in addition to Christmas and Easter. The children's choir is open to anyone in grades 3-8, and welcomes students from all schools. The children's choir's first rehearsal will take place on September 19th. For both groups, detailed schedules will be provided at the first rehearsal. Our choirs have no auditions and the ability to read music is not necessary. The only requirement we have of you is to come with an open heart and a goal of sharing your service with the parish community and God. All you have to do is show up; once you're here, we'll take care of everything you need. I look forward to seeing some new faces in our ministry, and I wish you the best as summer comes to a close and we activate our fall routines.

BAPTISM

Communal Baptisms are held on various Sundays during the year at 1:30PM in the Church. Please see the dates listed below.

RECONCILIATION

EUCCHARIST

Communion can be brought to the sick and homebound either at home or in a facility.

CONFIRMATION

Adults who have celebrated the Sacrament of Baptism and would like to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation are encouraged to call the Parish Office and speak to one of the priests.

MARRIAGE

Couples planning to marry are asked to call the Parish Office at least one year prior to their desired date so that arrangements can be made.

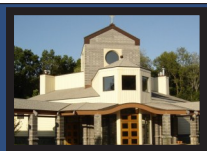
