

#### **PASTOR'S COLUMN**



#### **News & Updates**

As the summer months begin, it is a great opportunity as a welcoming community of faith for each of us to be conscious and intentional about hospitality for our guests and new families. In this spirit of hospitality, I ask parishioners who are able-bodied and don't have small children to sit in the middle of the pew, to save seats at the end of the pew for guests and families

with small children, and for those who arrive after Mass begins. I am sure that you'd all agree that having to climb over others to get a seat is not very welcoming. This simple yet thoughtful gesture goes a long way to help guests and families feel more comfortable and welcome. Thank you!

#### Reflection on the Readings

Bird watchers have been known to refer to sparrows as "junk birds." What this phrase suggests is that sparrows are too common, plentiful, and uninteresting to merit any attention. When a birder gets his sights on a sparrow, he turns the binoculars away in pursuit of something worthier. So might end the prestige of the poor bird, but for one thing: God keeps an eye on the little fellow, even if we don't.


Apparently, stock in the sparrow has never been very high among humans, though. In our Gospel, St. Matthew sets the price of two at a small coin. It was the cheapest life in the marketplace. So, when Jesus tells us that God is vigilant for the sparrow and notes the destiny of each one, we might be reassured that our own lives are valued even more so. You and I cannot be overlooked when God is monitoring the fate of every hair on our heads. I read somewhere that we lose a hundred hairs a day. Do you know what becomes of yours? Probably not, but you don't have to!

Friends, God's eye is on the world. Sparrows and hairs and hearts are all accounted for. So, is there any record we should keep track of? Yes: We want to be on the list of those who acknowledge Jesus before others. Jesus says this testifying band alone will he acknowledge before his Father. That's the register that matters, and the only way to be sure we're on it is to provide our witness to the world. Wearing a cross, sporting a bumper sticker, or quoting the Bible is optional. But live in imitation of Jesus, and you're onto something.

#### **SPOTLIGHT ON PRAYER**

Consider learning a new way to pray this summer! The spotlight for this week is called *Lectio Divina*, which is a method of praying with Scripture. It's a great way to meet God in His Word - read through the steps below and consider giving it a try this week!



"Lectio Divina" means 'holy reading', and it is a discipline which helps us to blend Scripture and prayer together so that we can go deeper in our relationship with God. It consists of four different steps: reading, meditation, prayer, and contemplation.

#### 1. Reading

- a. Choose a passage of Scripture (anything from 1 verse to 15 verses).
- b. Start by asking the Holy Spirit to shine light and insight on it as you read.
- c. Read it through several times. If possible, read it out loud.

#### 2. Meditation

- a. Think about it. Make your brain work hard. What was the person writing trying to say?
- b. What happens in the story?
- c. What does it mean for your life today?
- d. Is there one word or phrase which really shouts at you from the page?
- e. What is it saying about you and your life today?

#### 3. Prayer

- a. Respond to God. Speak out to Him your personal response to what you've read.
- b. Tell Him how it makes you feel. Tell Him what comforts you and what challenges you. Ask for His help to live out the truths you've uncovered today.

#### 4. Contemplation: Resting in God's presence

- a. Stop. Be still. Stop talking, stop asking and slow your brain down. This is the time for listening to Him, for letting the Holy Spirit talk back to you.
- b. Spend some time silently listening to God. Go beyond all the words you've read, and allow God to root you in truth and wrap you in love.
