Pray for the Repose of the Soul of our Holy Father, Pope Francis






JUBILEE 2025

Parish Day of Service Saturday, April 12th

The weather was cold and damp outside but inside it was warm and inviting. We started the day with a mass at 8:30 then we went down to the gym. Over 120 children, adults and whole families joined us for our Parish Day of Service. Everyone was so enthusiastic. It was great energy as we listened to uplifting Christian music.

We wrapped 1,120 cutlery sets for the Hoboken Shelter which distributes over 500 daily meals and helps shelter the homeless.

We assembled beautiful Easter centerpieces for the Sisters of Christian Charity in Mendham.

We assembled over 65 bags for our seminarians including gift cards, personal items and chocolate for Easter to let them know we support them in their calling.

We assembled bags for our Focus member Cheyenne Cook and her 2 roommates ministering to students and athletes on the campus at George Mason University.

We wrapped over 25 handmade baptismal blankets and 12 prayer shawls for our newly baptized babies and our sick lovingly made by our wonderfully talented parishioners.

We made over 200 cards to include in Troop-a-thon care packages for our deployed soldiers; words of support for the seminarians at Redemptis Mater in Newark and Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall.

We colored over 65 cheerful cards for seniors, hospital patients, soldiers, incarcerated youths and seminarians as part of the Color Me Smile organization.

It was a dad who led the group making car medallions for our priests to bless when parishioners get a new car; over 75 were completed.

Our volunteers answered questions on FreeRice. com, which donated 10 grains of rice for every correct answer. It is an educational, fun and great way to donate food to the needy all over the world.

Our Hospitality team brought bagels, coffee and water to keep us fueled for the day.

It really was a great way to meet new people and bond with them.

Thank you to all who made the day a success! It was another opportunity out of so many here at St. James that we can get closer to God through worshipping and working together.

PATH TO BECOMING A PERMANENT DEACON IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH



St. James' Deacon Candidate Mr. Darin Cerreto

Hi, my name is Darin Cerreto. My wife Lori and I along with our son Dominic are longtime parishioners at St. James the Apostle Church in Springfield, NJ. Lori and I first started attending St. James back in 1999. We

were welcomed by gracious priests and an inviting community which made it easy to call St. James our parish family.

Ministry always seemed to be flourishing at St. James however for many years we remained quiet parishioners in the church. Our first step into ministry was volunteering at the Parish Festival. Through the years we became more involved in ministries and prayerful opportunities to build and share faith.

In 2015, I became a member of the Pastoral Council. For ten years I gratefully worked with a faith-filled group of compassionate parishioners to assist our pastor through the joyful and challenging experiences our church would face. It was during this time that God began speaking to my heart to something more, the permanent diaconate.

We have been blessed with five amazing permanent deacons since I have been here at St. James the Apostle. Deacon Dan O'Neill was the one who first prompted my wife and me into ministry. Deacon Jerry Bongiovanni, Deacon Art Bandel, and Deacon Mike DeRoberts exemplified to me what it means to serve the church with kindness, humility and perseverance. And Deacon Hugh Keffer inspired me through his own journey to take the first steps towards the permanent diaconate. I admire each of these men who responded to God's call to serve their families at home and at the same time serve those in His church.

Through prayer and personal reflection, I hear God speaking to my heart, encouraging me to share the gifts He has equipped me with to bring others closer to Him. I can see how He has opened doors for me in my career to allow space and time to return to college. He has provided the loving support of my family to walk with me on this journey. He's given me direction through the guidance and leadership of Fr. David Santos and He has surrounded me with the most warm and joyful parish family anyone could ask for. He has also placed wonder and excitement within me to overcome any fear or anxiety of stepping out of my comfort zone.

As I continue my second semester of my studies at Seton Hall University, I humbly ask for your prayers. Please know that I am praying for each of you, and I thank God for the gift you are to St. James the Apostle Church.

WHAT IS A PERMANENT DEACON?

The terms "deacon" and "diaconate" derive from the Greek word diakonia which means "service" or "ministry." A deacon, then, is ordained by the Church for service. Deacons provide service in three ways:

Service of the Word — this includes preaching, offering catechetical instruction, spiritual counseling, instructing catechumens, giving retreats, conducting parish renewal programs, and reaching out to alienated Catholics

Service of the Altar — Deacons' role in the Eucharist — in addition to proclaiming the Gospel and articulating the Church's needs in the general intercessions — is to prepare the gifts and distribute communion at the Lord's table. Deacons may baptize children or adults, witness marriages in the name of the Church, bring Viaticum to the dying, and preside over wakes, funerals, and burial services.

Service of Charity — is as extensive as are human needs. Deacons minister in prisons and in hospitals. They visit the homebound and people in nursing homes. They serve the mentally ill, the chemically dependent, the abused and the battered, the old and the young, the abandoned, the dying and the bereaved, immigrants and refugees and the victims of racial and ethnic discrimination.


