PASTOR'S COLUMN

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

A cartoon in a Catholic magazine decades ago portrayed the scene in today's gospel: Jesus has just lazily doodled in the sand and gotten the attention of the self-righteous assembled crowd—their hands tightly gripping rocks with which to stone the woman caught in adultery. Jesus has forthrightly invited anyone—if you are without sin — "cast the first stone."

At that moment, lo and behold, a single stone flies over their heads and Jesus, with a bit of annoyance, complains, "Mom?!"

All joking aside, the incident in our Gospel shows vividly the **cruel** attitude of the scribes and Pharisees to people.

We hear that "the scribes and Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle."

All I can imagine is how embarrassed, ashamed, and dehumanized that poor woman must have felt - how cruel of those so-called religious figures to have acted in such a despicable way.

But then Jesus steps in and things change.

Two attitudes vividly stand out in our gospel scene:

- 1) The *cruel* attitude of the scribes and Pharisees
- 2) The *compassionate* attitude of Jesus

Friends, the basic difference between Jesus and the scribes and Pharisees was that, where these religious leaders simply saw the label of a sin committed, Jesus saw a person created and loved by God.

Now, this also doesn't mean that the consequences of sin can simply be dispensed with or ignored. For sure, that's not what's going on here. Too often we misunderstand the meaning of compassion and interpret the actions of Jesus in the Gospel as *forgiving and forgetting*. If that were the case, how would that help the sinner?

Yes, "compassion" means to suffer with and not simply have pity for, but the accompaniment happens along a path that must be different than the one upon which the sinner trod. What that means is, forgiveness implies contrition and a firm commitment to not go back down-that-same-road.

Yes, God's MERCY is the super abundant, lavishly offering forgiveness, for sure. Yet **God's JUSTICE**, which is just as true and as powerful, **necessitates that the sinner cannot go back to the same place** from whence he came.

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."





"LIGHT ON LENT"

The act of almsgiving can lead to our own conversion and a deeper relationship with God

Almsgiving, which includes giving our time, talent and treasure to others in need, is a hallmark of the Christian faith. It is an action that is modeled after the example of Jesus and how he continually gave himself to others in life and death.

Pope Benedict XVI reflected on almsgiving in his 2008 message for Lent, explaining that it can be an instrument of conversion.

By drawing close to others through almsgiving, we draw close to God; it can become an instrument for authentic conversion and reconciliation with Him and our brothers.

Benedict XVI encouraged Christians to embrace almsgiving during Lent, as well as other times of the year.

Lent invites us to "train ourselves" spiritually, also through the practice of almsgiving, in order to grow in charity and recognize in the poor Christ Himself. In the Acts of the Apostles, we read that the Apostle Peter said to the cripple who was begging alms at the Temple gate: "I have no silver or gold, but what I have I give you; in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, walk" (Acts 3,6). In giving alms, we offer something material, a sign of the greater gift that we can impart to others through the announcement and witness of Christ, in whose name is found true life.

Whenever we give alms, may we see the power it has in drawing us closer to God

As a result of St. James surpassing our Annual Appeal stretch goal last year, the parish recently received a \$24,000 rebate check from the Archdiocese of Newark, which we used for debt payment. The parish also received a \$13,000 credit to our 2025 Archdiocese Assessment charge for the rate reduction.
