PASTOR'S COLUMN



NEWS AND UPDATES

In the seminary, I had a language immersion experience in Italian. My Italian teacher began the first lesson by pointing to various things in the classroom and repeating words in Italian over and over again.

La finestra (the window)

La porta (the door)

Il libro (the book)

La tavola (the table)...etc.

When asked early on why he would repeat the same words and phrases over and over again, he responded:

"La ripetizione è la madre dell'apprendimento"

"Repetition is the mother of learning."

The language instructor held fast to the value that the ancients found in repetition.

Today's gospel begins with the same verse that formed the conclusion of last week's gospel:

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

In case we didn't get it last week, these are important words worthy of repetition. Not only does Jesus repeat Himself this week and once again claim that He is the *true bread come down from heaven*, but He also *ups-the-ante* and goes even further. His opponents at once questioned Jesus' meaning about his flesh being true food. In reply Jesus does not apologize for a possible misunderstanding. He does not say that his image was only a metaphor, not meant to be taken literally. Instead, he adds the term "blood" and continues with His preaching to mean that unless someone consumes His flesh *and blood* there is no life in that person. And so, with this qualification there is no room for misunderstanding; Jesus claims his flesh is true food and his blood true drink.

Jesus employs the ancient technique to teaching through repetition. He wants to make sure that his disciples learn this important lesson - for this is truly a lesson worth repeating - for "repetition is the mother of learning."


Jesus calls himself the "bread of life." And in calling himself "bread," He is saying that He is the source of true life. In claiming that unless we satiate our hunger for love and meaning and peace and joy in Him, everything else to which we turn for sustenance will not last, but only leave us hungry again. What Jesus is saying is that He is, in simple terms, the *meat* and *potatoes* of what truly matters!

Once we receive your application, you will be called for an interview. If you have any questions, please reach out to Ana.






