PASTOR'S COLUMN



Reflection on the Readings

This Sunday the world commemorates what remains the ultimate demonstration of worldly might and power: the nuclear bombing of Hiroshima, Japan, by the United States in 1945. Nagasaki was also bombed three days later. Seventy thousand Japanese men, women, and children were killed at once. Seventy thousand more died of radiation exposure in the weeks to follow. Over the next five years, more would contract cancers related to the

event. Hundreds of thousands of lives were taken to ensure Japan's unconditional surrender in World War II. Not all historians are convinced it was necessary.

Human power and might is a sobering commodity. We can wield power in many ways: in military strength as well as economic muscle. We threaten with a stick or wave the carrot. Other routes to power include celebrity, physical attraction, technological savvy, education, birthright, good connections, and the irresistible force of personal charisma.

The idea that there's an authority higher than all other authorities doesn't resonate so much nowadays. A celestial power stronger than the biggest army on Earth is hard to imagine. The Church used to wield teachings about hell and heaven as the stick-or-carrot to end all sticks-and-carrots. But as life spans lengthen and relativism runs rampant, many of us find a comfortable spot in this world that short-circuits our thoughts about what comes next. The religious imagination is not as active as it used to be... and that's why today's feast is so important.

In our Gospel passage, Jesus stands on Tabor and this God-nearness makes him brilliant as the sun. The Father from Heaven speaks—not to Jesus, but to his disciples, including us. The Divine Voice claims paternity of Jesus, as at his Baptism. But three words are added to the message: Listen to him.


Jesus is the Word. And this Word has power to save the world.

I hope everyone is enjoying their summer. As you probably have seen in past bulletins, registration for this coming school year 2023-2024 is well on the way. We are also looking to start a Pre-K and K craft room, so that parents with younger children can have that hour session and the younger children could have a fun arts and craft hour as well. FAMILY FAITH FORMATION AT SAINT JAMES

We are excited to begin a new year of Family Faith Formation! St. James the Apostle Families with children in 1st – 6th grade are invited to attend one session a month. At least one parent is required to attend with their children, but both are highly encouraged. Sessions will run for two hours, beginning with Mass, and followed by a welcome and introduction to the theme for the month. Then, children will gather into age-appropriate groups for a deeper dive into that theme. During that time, we will offer a parent session that helps support your families practically in how to best develop the faith at home. Each session concludes with a family activity/experience that ties into the monthly theme and a resource to continue the conversation at home.





Be Open to Transfiguration

What is Christianity finally about? These days if you ask almost anyone who doesn't know the Bible you'll probably hear an answer like this: "Being a good person" or "following the golden rule." No offense to the golden rule, but our faith is simply much stranger than that. This week's feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is a luminous example of this. Jesus becomes radiantly and overwhelmingly beautiful. The glory of God literally shines forth from his body and even his clothes. Here we see that Christianity is not mainly a moral system, but a relationship with God in Christ, one that finally makes human beings gloriously beautiful.

Now we can see our good and bad deeds in a new and de-centered way. Our morality isn't about a heaven or hell scorecard. It's about lives open (or closed) to transfiguration, lives capable of revealing the glory of God in Christ to the world. Spouses, children, friends, co-workers, priests, consecrated women and men, and so on — we are all called to let the beauty of Jesus make our lives beautiful, little by little. His beauty in us is the center of our faith.
