#### THE PASTOR'S LETTER

Father John Gabriel

#### Dear Parish Family,

Those of you who are especially observant may have noticed that there are a few simple and subtle changes that began last week during our celebration of Holy Mass on Sunday. I wanted to explain a few of them to you so that you can understand where they came from. Over the summer, Fr. Silvano, the deacons, Janet and I met to discuss some liturgical issues. Overall, we acknowledged that our celebrations of Holy Mass here at St. James are beautiful and done very well. The changes decided were rooted in three things: to make sure we are doing what the Church documents that guide the celebration of Mass call for (especially the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, the universal Church document that guides each parish through the world), to keep in sync with those things asked of us by the Catholic Bishops of the United States, and to consider the things our parishioners told us during "A Time to Dream." During these meetings last January when our entire parish family was invited to tell us their hopes and dreams for the future of our parish, many of you hoped that our Church itself would be a prayerful place especially before Mass begins. So, in an effort to keep the Church proper as prayerful as possible, the ministers of the Liturgy will gather in the Gathering Area and begin the procession from there.

Also, you may have noticed that the table where the chalices, etc. are kept before we bring them to the altar has been moved from behind the plenum wall to near where the Altar Servers sit. This is to keep the walkway behind the wall clear so that, in between Masses, people will approach the tabernacle for private prayer. I've been told that the tabernacle is oriented toward that walkway behind the plenum wall because the architect hoped people would pray back there. We will be putting a few chairs back there to use during your prayer time before the Blessed Sacrament. Also, the movement of the table will prevent so many people passing in front of the tabernacle during Mass. And, you may notice that the Altar Servers have been kneeling during the Eucharistic Prayer (the Consecration) instead of standing as they had been doing. This is to help the children join the entire Church in the proper posture one takes before Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Kneeling is a beautiful gesture of love and reverence, and it's important our children become accustomed to it from an early age. In addition to a few other minor changes involving Extraordinary Ministers, you may notice that at some Masses people will be called up who are bringing Holy Communion to the sick. The dismissal of these Extraordinary Ministers helps us all to remember the sick and join with them who are unable to be physically present at the Lord's altar each Sunday. We will no longer put consecrated hosts in receptacles that people present to us when they come up to receive Communion themselves. Anyone who brings Communion to the sick and is not on the Extraordinary Minister schedule needs to speak with me personally. It is our hope that these small changes will help us continue the tradition of beautiful, reverent and worthy celebrations of Holy Mass here at St. James. May we be aware in each moment of the great gift we have in Mass, the most perfect prayer we have as Christians. It was instituted by Christ Himself, and continues to be the one place where we come closest to Him in that intimate and amazing encounter our God.
