



A MESSAGE FROM FR. DAVID



Christmas is often the occasion for when we take a trip down memory lane. We remember not only the traditions, sights, and smells of Christmastime, but especially the people who, for various reasons, may or may not be with us this Christmas day.

In our home growing up, the nativity scene with its manger and figurines, would ornately be displayed in our family's living room. Looking at the images of Mary, Joseph, and the baby Jesus, I would envision what Jesus' family was like in comparison to mine.

I don't believe it farfetched to think that Jesus would have had similar curious ponderings about his own family during those hidden years of his life that we hear about in the Scriptures. Why wouldn't he, right? If we take a close look at the beginning of the Gos-

pel of Matthew, we will read a lengthy list of names belonging to Jesus' genealogy – and what a list of characters! Certainly, worthy of disputing any of our claims that our family is a unique lot!

In this litany of saints and sinners - Jesus' literal flesh and blood relatives - we see a whole assortment of personalities who gave rise, eventually, to the Christ who would save us. We find the patriarchs Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; we find the great King of Israel, David; in the same lineage, we find the name of the harlot Rahab; and the mother of Solomon, Bathsheba, with whom King David had an adulterous affair; we hear of Rehoboam, one of Israel's most dysfunctional kings; finally, we hear of Zadok, Achim and Elliud, figures about whom we know nothing. What a bunch! And through them all God was laying out a path for his son Jesus.

And as you can see, this "path" wasn't the yellow-brick-road that we would all imagine it to be for the Prince of Peace. The many names that make up the hereditary lineage of Jesus is peppered with morally unadulterated and totally depraved persons. Exemplary lives, wasted lives, deeply compromised lives, forgotten lives – yet all of them were integral parts of God's divine plan to save the world. Those with seemingly perfect lives and those with obviously not-so-perfect souls, contributed to the flesh taken on by the Word of God!

And so, as those beloved and not-so-beloved family members - in memory or in person - fill our homes, our hearts, and our minds this Christmas, we should remember the rather untidy family line from which Jesus descended. And with that, be reassured that God knows what he is doing. That no matter how out of control our families may seem or in control they may be, **God has a plan...and we are all a part of it.** And just in case you forget, just take a gander at the baby in the manger, and all those around him!

- Bereavement Services: provided is a list of area parishes that offer Bereavement Groups, included are schedules of meetings and contact information. In addition are details on programs the Archdiocese offers for parents who are grieving the loss of their child.
- Healthy Recipes: Three Immune System Boosting Soup recipes plus two other healthy soups. One a beet Soup and the other is a Garlic and Spinach Soup. All five recipes are a great way to get vegetables into the family's diet.
- Best Ways to Combat Seasonal Affective Disorder: During the winter months, especially here in the northern areas of our country, the shorter days of sunlight can affect a person's mood or give them a sense of lethargy. On average about 4% to 6% of the American population suffer from this disorder, with more people experiencing a milder form. About three out of every four cases belong to women. The handout will give you additional information on symptoms and approaches researchers have found to be beneficial.

NORTH END BOY




A parishioner of St. Bartholomew's, Kevin Brady, has written a book called *North End Boy*, a memoir set in Elizabeth, N.J. Proceeds from book sales will be donated to St. Benedict's in Newark, which is featured in the book.

North End Boy tells the story of seven friends coming of age in 1978

against a backdrop of urban crime, abandoned factories and political corruption. Over a thirty-six hour period, the young friends struggle to find their place in a changing city and a changing nation. One gets into the family business. One moves out. One finds redemption in the Catholic Church, Another doesn't.

An intensely local book, North End Boy is also a larger meditation on post-war America, as seen through the eyes of a first generation American with immigrant sensibilities and working-class roots. It is also a story of Catholic conversion and redemption that takes place on the gritty streets of Elizabeth and Newark.




