PASTOR'S COLUMN

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

You may be familiar with the movie **We Were Soldiers** (2002). The movie depicts the first major battle between Americans and the North Vietnamese Army in the battle of la Drang.

Mel Gibson plays Lt. Gen Harold Moore. Part of the significance of this battle is that it was one of the first

times that Americans employed the use of UH-61 Helicopters "Huey". These helicopters were integral in jungle combat.

Early in the battle, it became clear that casualties would be mounting and that fresh supplies would be needed sooner rather than later. Almost immediately, a top priority for the command was to prepare a landing zone. They begin to tie detonation "det" cord around trees to bring them down. They clear the brush and remove debris, all so that the helicopter can land. The soldiers swarm around actively preparing the ground for the helicopters to bring in supplies and ammunition and evacuate the wounded.

In Advent – as in our spiritual life - I think we are like those soldiers who prepare the landing zone, and God is the helicopter that's trying to land. The Advent Season is a time when we clear the ground and make-way for God to land.

Friends, God desires so much to be with us and to land in our hearts, but He won't take the chance unless the ground is made ready...unless the landing zone is prepared.

Brothers and sisters, today is a good day to wrap spiritual "det" (detonation) cord around those things that keep us <u>from prayer, works</u> of charity, from <u>seeing the importance of having a personal relationship with God</u>. Today is a good day to begin separating yourself from the influences of *ideas, things*, and even *people* that turn you away from God rather than draw you closer to Him


Blue Christmas Mass Wednesday, December 20th at 7:00 p.m.




