PASTOR'S COLUMN

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

My mother never had difficulty staying awake—she would wait up for every family member until they were home safe in their beds. Or she'd stay up all night just to make sure bags were packed and all was ready for an adventurous summer road trip the next day.

I didn't really appreciate my mother's secret to staying awake until recently. It wasn't like mom danced around the living room or drank pots of coffee to stay awake (although she was known to engage in both of those activities from time to time). But recently I read somewhere that sleep experts advise engaging in lively conversations to get your mind moving when you're feeling drowsy. Conversation that was mom's secret during her late night vigils—conversations with God. Mom has always been a world-class pray-er. She says the rosary nightly and a Hail Mary or Our Father whenever she has the chance. She shares everything with God—her hopes and dreams for the family and her greatest concerns.


While the rest of the household slumbered, she kept watch with her best friend and was ever ready at the appointed hour. I can't help but think of my mother's superhuman-like power to wrestle sleep each time I hear Jesus' command to "stay awake!"

Friends, Advent is not our annual invitation to winter slumber and daydreams about white Christmases and chestnuts roasting on open fires. There are "days to come," Isaiah reveals, when peace will replace the violence of our churning, restless world. "Stay awake!" Jesus reminds us, so that we don't miss the signature of those days. Nor the vital decisions each of us has yet to make.







AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR OUR PARISH COMMUNITY

Dear Parish Community:

The Archdiocese of Newark has been notified that an individual named (Horacio) Daniel Medina has been falsely presenting himself as a Catholic priest in the northern New Jersey area where he is celebrating Mass in people's homes and then ministering confessions and blessing homes and religious articles.

Mr. Medina was permanently removed from the clerical state by the Holy Father in 2013. As a result of the laicization, he is forbidden from wearing clerical dress and from functioning in any capacity as a priest. He is not authorized to celebrate the sacraments, including the Eucharist, or engage in any priestly ministry.

Prior to his laicization, Mr. Medina was arrested and charged with child abuse. His name appears on the Archdiocese of Newark's list of credibly accused priests.

We urge both clergy and the faithful to refrain from participating in any further attempt by Mr. Medina to offer the Mass or administer other sacraments. We strongly encourage that any such activity be reported immediately to the Archdiocese of Newark at 973-497-4254. We ask that all the faithful join in prayer that Christ may bring healing and hope to anyone who has been abused by a priest or by anyone in the Catholic Church.

Any person who wishes to report an incident of abuse or misconduct committed by a member of the Archdiocese of Newark is urged to immediately inform their County Prosecutor or other law enforcement office as well as the Archdiocese's Department for the Protection of the Faithful.
