## **PASTOR'S COLUMN**



#### **REFLECTION ON THE READINGS**

Today's prayers and readings have a lot to say to us as we begin this Lenten season. For example, the Opening Prayer (Collect) that the priest offers before we hear the readings has us praying:

Grant, almighty God, through the yearly observance of holy Lent, that we may grow in **understanding** of the

riches hidden in Christ and by worthy conduct pursue their effects.

As a worshipping community, in our Opening Prayer, we ask to grow in understanding. Now...who can't use an increase in *understanding*?

I truly believe, that at some level, each of us desires to understand God more; we want to understand to a greater extent who God is and what God is doing in our lives and in the world.

There is something about our human nature that longs to understand – to comprehend the mysteries of God. I would even venture to say that a lot of what we pray for has, in some way or another, to do with "understanding."

Lord, help me to understand myself.

Lord, help me to understand my spouse.

Lord, help me to understand my illness.

Lord, help me to understand why this happened or that happened...

And the difficulty comes when no response is heard.

When our prayers seem to go unheard and unanswered.

The crippling effect of which can lead us to doubt.

#### Well, what do we do then?

I think that in today's Gospel, Jesus shows us "the way" in the journey he personally makes into the desert.

- Though Satan tempted Jesus, it was the Spirit who was guiding Jesus into this experience.

Friends, today we are reminded that Lent is a journey into the "desert" for each of us. The desert is an uncertain and uncomfortable place because it's a place of **vulnerability**...and with **vulnerability** comes **doubt**. And with **doubt** – especially when it comes to the questions of God – things can get **confusing** and **frustrating**.

Friends, just as courage is persisting in the face of fear, so *faith is persisting in the presence of doubt.* 

You see, Faith becomes a **commitment**, a **practice** and a **pact** that is sustained by belief. When it comes to faith, doubt is not just agitation or a vulnerability, it's not even a **weakness**; **doubt can be a strength.**

## Family Faith Formation

**Confirmation** preparation **Year 1** and **Year 2** groups – Our next session will be all together on **Tuesday, February 20th at 7PM in the** 

Church. Fr. David will be our presenter and he will be walking us through every step of the Mass. We know the Mass is very important and is the center of our Faith. We know we must go to Mass on Sundays and that we have the opportunity to go on a daily basis. We know the responses, when we stand, when we kneel, but do we know what it all means? Fr. David will help us better understand what happens at each step of the Mass so that we can live it more fully and appreciate it even more than we already do. Each candidate must attend with at least one of your parents.

Our next Family Faith session will be held on **Saturday**, **February 24th at 3PM in the Church** for all families (there will only be one session). It will be a walkthrough the Mass taught by Fr. David Santos. For those families with children in the Family Faith Formation program and the Confirmation process, since all the Confirmation candidates must attend their walkthrough of the Mass on **Tuesday**, **February 20th at 7PM in the Church**, please plan to attend the Tuesday session instead. This way you will be able to experience the session with all your children at the same time instead of having to come to two sessions.

Anyone who is not able to attend the Saturday session at 3PM, please plan to attend the Tuesday session at 7PM, and vice versa. There will be a QR code to sign in on both days, so that attendance can be taken that way.

Confirmation Candidates, As stated in my email about Lent activities, next weekend there is a need for candidates to help at the Fish Fry on Friday, February 23 from 5:45PM to 7:45PM (which would count as a parish event in which you participate). Also, on Saturday, February 24 at 5:15PM and Sunday, February 25 at 10:15AM and 12:15PM, there is a need for volunteers to help bring the food collected before each Mass for Family Promise from the Church to the School and help sort through them (this would count as part of your "volunteer hours" and would probably take no more than 30 minutes). If interested in any of these, please email me so that I can give your names to the people in charge of the events.





## **2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS**

 The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.


On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of Lent, February 18</u> to <u>The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity,</u> May 26, 2024.

\*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.




