PASTOR'S COLUMN



REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

I heard this account recently:

Mary asked a woman in her office, Tracy, why she was so aggravated with a guy she worked with. "I'll tell you why," she screamed at her, "because that man is my enemy. If he were dying in the street, I would walk right by him."

What made the situation even more uncomfortable was that this statement was coming from the mouth of a woman she generally found to be pleasant and generous in nature. These were some of the most chilling words Mary had ever heard; they literally gave her goosebumps.

When Mary asked what the man could possibly have done to have earned such a vehement condemnation, Tracy said, with a terrible expression,

"He complained about one of my kids not being friendly on the phone. Even though it was so long ago," she continued, "I can't stand him. But it's ok..."

What seems to have happened in this story - and in fact what happens too often in our own lives - is that we can easily turn the notion of enemies into the equivalent of a benign spot on our soul: nothing to worry about, no threat to the soul. He hates me, I hate her, it is what it is...Just as long as they stay over there and me over here, we're good!

But here's the thing - to not address the *hatred, resentment*, and *anger* that one has for one's enemy is **to give it room to grow.**

Tracy had made an enemy of a man who presumed to criticize her child. That might seem a trivial thing, but we do not know the whole of anyone else's story. That being said, the woman's real enemy, though, was the creation of her seething resentment, which was wounding her, and not him.

Yes, Jesus does acknowledge the fact that enemies do exist...but He tell us that we can do - and should do - something about it.

Friends, to Love our Enemies means a great deal more than to simply not wish evil upon them or simply accept that "it is what it is."


To Love our Enemy means making a conscious effort to find a path to mercy and forgiveness, for their sake and our own.

Steubenville Youth Conference 2025 July 11-13, 2025


As we did last summer, we are organizing a trip to the **Steubenville Youth Conference** at Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio this summer.


