

PASTOR'S COLUMN



REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

We see a lot of things advertised with that four-letter word these days: "Free!" (Maybe not as much as we'd hope). And we've grown wisely skeptical of such claims. We've all learned by now, sometimes bitterly, that there's no free lunch, no free subscriptions, and no free merchandise. The hard truth is that everything

costs something, and if we can't see the price tag, even more reason to suspect we're about to be fleeced.

So when Saint Paul says he offers the gospel free of charge wherever he goes, we have good reason to doubt that. **The gospel isn't free and doesn't even come cheap.** The gospel cost Jesus the cross; cost many saints their martyrdom; cost Paul himself continuous turmoil. If Paul brought the gospel to his audiences for free, it's because he was making the down payments on their behalf every day.

And when we hear the Good News of Jesus Christ proclaimed today, it may seem like it's free, or at least like cheap grace served fresh daily. It's not. Think of how Peter's mother-in-law was healed of a fever at the touch of Jesus' hand. Was that free? Instantly she felt compelled to service. Jesus, too, after being waited on by this grateful and generous woman, might have wanted to settle in after sunset to a little casual conversation with his friends. But no: The whole town was brought to him with their diseases and demons. Did Jesus give it all away for free? He may not have charged each sick person, as a doctor would, but the cost to him was everything he had: time, comfort, space for family and friends. Eventually the ministry of Jesus cost him his security and his life.


It's ironic, really, that the lectionary folks coupled this gospel passage about the exhausting ministry of Jesus with Job's lament: *Isn't life on earth a drudgery?* But where Job goes wrong is in his final summary: "I shall not see happiness again." Friends, we know the story: Job's hope is restored, as well as his family and his livelihood, just as Paul receives his martyr's crown and Jesus has Easter morning. The gospel may not be free, but it's worth every penny!








Presenter Dr. Kathleen Detlet

2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.


On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the <u>First Sunday</u> of <u>Lent, February 18</u> to <u>The Solemnity of the</u> <u>Most Holy Trinity, May 26, 2024.</u>

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

DEACON MICHAEL'S KNEE REPLACEMENT RECUPERATION UPDATE

Hello all, thank you for your concerns, thoughts and prayers. Back on December 11th, 2023, I had a total knee replacement that was supposed to happen back in September, but I could not get the medical clearance for the surgery due to some recurring heart issues. What I thought was going to be a simple recuperation turned out to be a very painful ordeal. I've been going through physical therapy for past seven weeks but have not been progressing to the point that the doctors feel I should be at, so this past Wednesday I had to return to the OR at Overlook, for a procedure called "a manipulation" where they manually bend and twist the knee to normal capacity. OUCH! They say in a day or two afterwards there would be significant improvement. I am anticipating on returning to active ministry in hopefully 4 weeks depending on how the procedure turns out.

Again, I would like to thank you all for your thoughts and prayers and hopefully I'll at least be seeing you at a weekend Mass.
