## PASTOR'S COLUMN



### Reflection on the Readings

Loyalty is a quality we value highly. We want our friends to be loyal. We expect our families to be. We hope for some modicum of reliability from bosses or employees. In fact, every meaningful relationship involves loyalty to be viable.

This week we celebrate Independence Day, a festival of flag-waving and fireworks through which we declare our pride in the nation that provides us so many liberties. As Americans, we are deeply grateful that we do. We know that many around the world would be just as eager to belong to this story because of all the freedoms and opportunities it provides, even if our story isn't a fairy tale.

How our nation grows that belonging sensibly, safely, and justly remains a problem to be solved and worth pondering as we approach the celebration of Independence Day. This is a tension that is on display for the whole world these days.

With that being said: **what is the foundation of your many loyalties?**

It's quite frightening these days to see fellow Americans rabidly tearing at each other's throats. I can't help but ask over and over again in my heart: Where are we to go? What are we to do as a nation, as a people?

Friends, my intention with this reflection isn't to preach with political rhetoric, since I believe that is outside the scope of a religious reflection. My intention as a priest is to bring to bear the Gospel - that we all believe and value as Christians - into a time that's marked by tumult, ideologies, disparaging narratives, fear and **the lack of a willingness to listen to each other.**

In short, I believe the Gospel is where our loyalties should stand firm, particularly when (for better or for worse) so much around us seems to be crumbling or changing (depending on which perspective you hold).

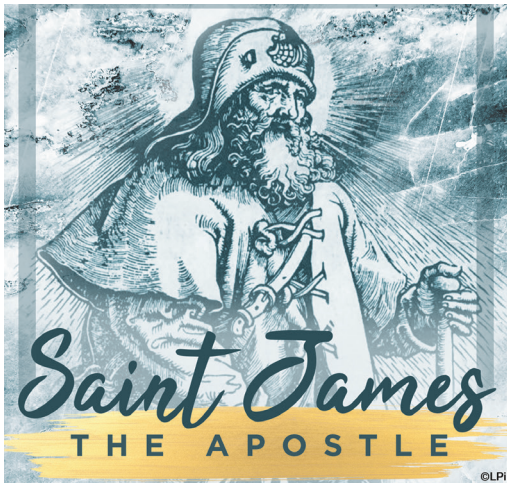
**Friends, our loyalty needs to be anchored in the Gospel for the simple reason that the Gospel can guide us towards the realization of God's will in the here and now.**

We can see this dynamic in many of the most successful protests of the Civil Rights era which were predicated on Christian ideas of nonviolence, and a Scriptural understanding of the human person. Remaining loyal to the Gospel helps us to come face-to-face with important principles of Catholic social teaching, principles on display for us in our readings today:

- the dignity of the human person.
- the value of solidarity, "we're all in this together."
- a preferential option for the poor.

These principles need to be present in any Catholic's response to injustice. If it's not grounded in these principles, then it inevitably ends up being about power— that I need to assert my power, in situations where I feel powerless. It becomes a struggle over power, rather than a transformational relationship into how God wants us to live as brothers and sisters.





## PASTOR'S COLUMN (cont)

Friends, today's the message is clear: **we must keep our eyes on Christ...**not our television set or social media accounts. Jesus must be our premier social commentator and influencer. Because if not, we will make the fatal mistake of thinking our own ideas are the solutions to society's problems. Only with Christ can we develop authentic reforms and programs which ensure true justice and freedom for all.

May God continue to bless the United States of America!

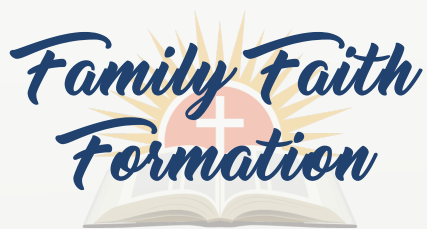
