Reflection on the Readings

Remember the story of The Wizard of Oz? Four characters—the Scarecrow, the Tin Man, the Cowardly Lion, and of course Dorothy—are in search of what they believe will make them complete. The Scarecrow wants a brain, the Tin Man needs a heart, the Cowardly Lion seeks courage, and Dorothy just wants to go home. Together they make a perilous journey to the Land of Oz where they encounter a wonderful wizard who shows them that everything

they desire is already in their possession.

To awaken them to this truth, the wizard gives them outward signs of their inward realities. The Scarecrow gets a diploma, the Tin Man a testimonial, the Cowardly Lion a medal for bravery, and Dorothy finds out that home is where her heart is.

Like our four heroes, we are all in search of the treasure of life, the priceless pearl of fulfillment. It is for this reason that God made us. "I came that you might have life," Jesus says, "and have it to the fullest" (John 10:10).

All that we seek is within us, but not of our own creative invention, but by the gift of God. Maybe a better way to say it is, because we are baptized, God's divine life is radically present in us, as is the Kingdom of God. But to obtain this buried treasure of God's kingdom, it is necessary to divest ourselves of worldly attachments. The seekers of the parable sell all that they have. What good are the wealth, power, security, and comfort of this passing world if we never achieve the real treasure of God's lasting kingdom?

Family Faith Formation

Dear St. James Families - I am including the Family Faith Formation and Confirmation flyer again this week, because one of the dates for the Family Faith Formation meetings, the one in February, has changed to a Saturday afternoon, and for the Confirmation groups, that date has also been added to their calendar. I will explain it at our first meeting, but I wanted to make you aware of it, so that you know ahead of time and can add it to your calendars.

We are looking for volunteers to help at this year's Family Faith Formation Program. The commitment would be for only one session a month (for 1 hour), but we would ask that you commit to a specific time session (after the 8AM Mass, after the 10AM mass, or after the 12PM mass) and volunteer at the same time session for each of the six Family Faith Formation sessions. The volunteers would serve in various capacities: Catechists, classroom Aids, and Hall monitors. We are also looking to start a Pre-K and K craft room, so that parents with younger children can have that hour session and the younger children could have a fun arts and craft hour as well. FAMILY FAITH FORMATION AT SAINT JAMES

We are excited to begin a new year of Family Faith Formation! St. James the Apostle Families with children in 1st – 6th grade are invited to attend one session a month. At least one parent is required to attend with their children, but both are highly encouraged. Sessions will run for two hours, beginning with Mass, and followed by a welcome and introduction to the theme for the month. Then, children will gather into age-appropriate groups for a deeper dive into that theme. During that time, we will offer a parent session that helps support your families practically in how to best develop the faith at home. Each session concludes with a family activity/experience that ties into the monthly theme and a resource to continue the conversation at home.

NEWS IN THE CATHOLIC WORLD: WATER CREMATION

It is traditional for a deceased Catholic to be buried in the ground or interred in a tomb or mausoleum. While the Catholic Church does allow for cremation, it comes with some requirements – like that the remains must still be buried or inurned in a columbarium – and strictly restricts the scattering of the ashes. There is a newer method of cremation, however, that uses an alkaline water mix that completely dissolves biological materials, and bishops are warning it is not suitable for Catholics.

The process is known as alkaline hydrolysis, aquamation, or "water cremation." According to the Cremation Association of North America, the process entails placing the body of the deceased within a sealed chamber, where an acidic watery mix breaks down the body while being pressurized and heated... The biological remains dissolved into the fluid, however, are simply disposed of in the local wastewater treatment, or even used for fertilizer, and this is where the Catholic Church has a real problem with the process.

The Catholic Church insists that human remains be treated with respect to protect the dignity of the deceased, just the same as when they were alive. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "bodies of the dead must be treated with respect and charity, in faith and hope of the Resurrection. The burial of the dead is a corporal work of mercy, it honors the children of God who are temples of the Holy Spirit."

While the Vatican has yet to weigh in on water cremations, US bishops have offered guidance to the faithful... Recently retired St. Louis Archbishop Robert J. Carlson concluded that "this form of cremation in its current practice violates the dignity of the deceased human person." The archdiocese went on to caution Catholics to avoid water cremations "until another suitable means of disposing of the liquid remnant can be established."

[Some bishops] question if the process really is more eco-friendly, as the remains and chemicals used to dissolve them are all sent into the sewer. They also noted that, although water cremations are cheaper, respect and reverence for human bodies must not be sacrificed for a cheaper, quicker disposition for medical research facilities.
