PASTOR'S COLUMN

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

A father remarked: "when I think of perspective, I am often reminded of a conversation between me and my son in the summer he turned four. That spring my son Mark had asked for a spot in the family garden to call his own. He turned the soil, broke the clumps, and planted his favorite vegetable - corn. Toward

the middle of July, Mark was concerned that his corn was not growing fast enough. I tried to reassure him that the corn was doing just fine by quoting him the familiar benchmark used by farmers, "...knee high by the fourth of July." My lesson on perspective came with his retort: "My knees or yours?" 😂

The famous spiritual writer Father Henri Nouwen recounts his first meeting with Mother Teresa of Calcutta this way, he writes: "I had the opportunity of meeting Mother Teresa of Calcutta. I was struggling with many things at the time and decided to use the occasion to ask Mother Teresa's advice. As soon as we sat down, I started explaining all my problems and difficulties – trying to convince her of how complicated it all was! When, after ten minutes of elaborate explanation, I finally became quiet, Mother Teresa looked at me and quietly said: "Well, when you spend one hour a day adoring your Lord in prayer and never do anything which you know is wrong...you will be fine!"

At that moment, Mother Teresa's simple advice punctured his big balloon of complex self-complaints and pointed him far beyond himself to the place of real healing. Reflecting on this brief but decisive encounter, Henri realized that he had raised a question from **below**, and that she had given an answer from **above**. At first, her answer didn't seem to fit his question, but then he began to see that <u>her answer came</u> from God's place and not from the place of his complaints.

Friends, isn't it true that our lives are inundated with urgent questions (from *below*)?

- How can I find joy and happiness?
- What is the right way of living?
- What am I to do with my life?
- Whom shall I marry?
- Where shall I live?
- What gifts do I have to share?
- What do I do with my loneliness?
- Why am I so needy for affection, approval, or power?
- How can I overcome my fears, my shame, my addictions, and my sense of inadequacy or of failure?

PASTOR'S COLUMN CONTINUED

We all have a lot of questions throughout our lives, especially in tough moments. But I think that most of the time we respond to these questions from **below** with answers from **below**. We stay fixed in **<u>our</u>** world; in our particular situation, limiting our vision to what is immediately around us, what we can see, hear, and touch. And the result is often more confusion.

Henri, at the time of his encounter with Mother Teresa, was struggling with many of these questions. He learned something that he already knew but wasn't living out. His perspective changed from <u>below</u> to <u>above</u>. He began seeking answers from <u>above</u> to his questions from <u>below</u>.

Friends, when we begin to see things from God's place – **above** – a whole new world opens up to us. **That's what's happening in our readings this Sunday.**

The little boy Mark in the story that I shared with you was willing to determine the readiness of his precious corn crop by using his own measure, the height of his knees rather than that of his father's, who knew better. **We often fall into the same trap, don't we?**

From **below**, our faith can appear as small as a mustard seed; but from **above**, such *faith* is enough for the Lord to work with. So next time you ask a question from **below** may you seek the answer from **above**, then watch your perspective change.






