PASTOR'S COLUMN

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS



As we continue our Lenten journey, the Church places before us the mystery of the **Transfiguration**—a moment meant not only to reveal Christ's glory, but also to strengthen weary disciples who are walking a difficult path. In many ways, this is exactly what Lent is: a **climb**, often steep, that promises a new vision at the summit.

In my homily this weekend, I shared the story of a man asked by God simply to *push* a heavy stone. Day after day he pushed, and nothing seemed to change—until God revealed that the pushing had already transformed him. **His strength, focus, and character had all been reshaped in the struggle.** The task was never about moving the stone; it was about allowing **God's grace to move him.**

So it is with us. Much of what we carry—our worries, illnesses, losses, fears—may not disappear the moment we wish them to. But if we persevere with faith, these very crosses strengthen the soul. God moves the stone in His time. Our task is to keep pushing.

The Transfiguration gives us a glimpse of why this matters. Jesus allows Peter, James, and John to see—just for a moment—what awaits those who remain with Him: the radiant life of God, the glory hidden beneath the ordinary, the victory beyond the cross. That glimpse was enough to carry them through dark hours.

We, too, need such glimpses. And they do come—sometimes in prayer, sometimes in the Eucharist, sometimes through the goodness and holiness we encounter in others.

As you walk your own Lenten path, remember:

Keep pushing until something happens.

Not because the stone will move immediately, but because *you* will.

And at the summit of this season—and of life—God will show us the glory that has been waiting for us all along.

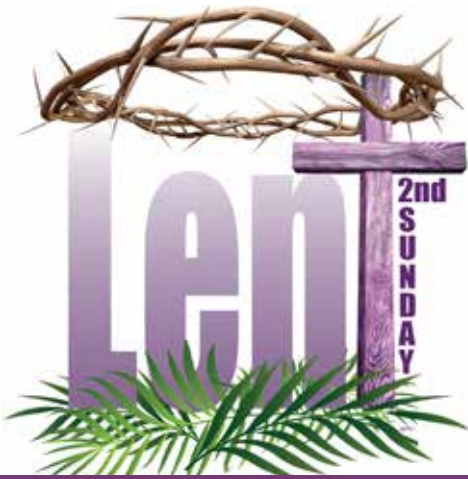

HOLY WHYS: DEACON HUGH REPLIES



Dear Deacon Hugh:

I do not attend Mass regularly. The fact is, I am very concerned with the teaching of the Church. Isn't it true that the Church teaches people to be door mats? To deny their talents and pretend they are humble?

Dear A:

The Church teaches humility as a cherished virtue. Humility does not mean a submissiveness, a passiveness, a willingness to be walked on, or a desire to live in the doghouse. It isn't about being a doormat. No, humility means seeing ourselves honestly; not as we may portray on our social media, but as we are in the sight of God when we examine our conscience.

Humility means always being thankful for a talent we have and conscious of its limitations. Contrast this with egotism which seeks the admiration and applause of others regardless of our shortcomings. Recognizing our limitations and not pretending to be someone we are not captures the sense of this virtue.

Consider the example of John the Baptist who, when asked about a new and upcoming preacher named Jesus, resisted applauding himself and responded, "He must increase; I must decrease." Humility teaches us to perceive our limitations. Bending the knee before God, submitting our pride to the conditions for entering heaven, requires the virtue of humility. It is, then, a strength and not a weakness.

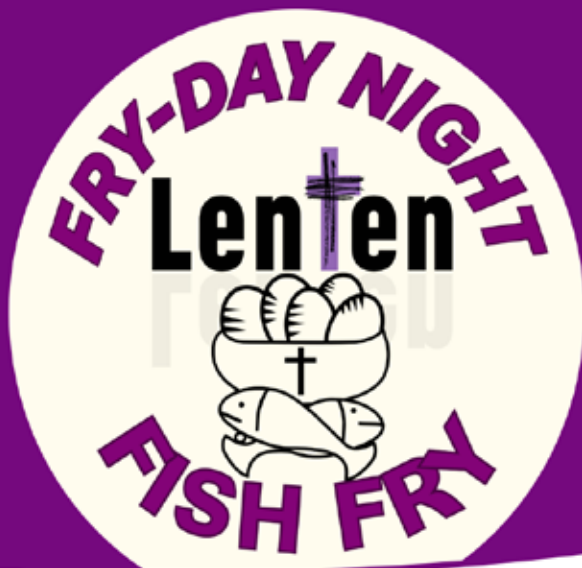

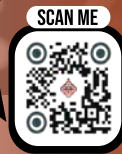
