

PASTOR'S COLUMN

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS



Imagine standing atop a mountain on a fairly clear day. You stare out as far as the eye can see... and the next thing you know clouds begin to roll through. As the wind picks up, so the clouds quickly thicken. Next thing you know, the peak is covered with dense clouds. The air darkens and feelings of isolation and disorientation begin to creep in. You're unsettled and confused, wondering for how long.

I would venture to say that most of us have experienced this firsthand... maybe not in the physical sense of standing in the clouds atop a mountain, but almost certainly in a **psychological/emotional/spiritual** sense when a life experience leaves you feeling like you're in a "cloud":

- This can be the experience of losing someone dear to you.
- It can be the loss of a job or the uncertainty of a big decision.
- Maybe you're standing tall at the peak of life when all of a sudden you receive a troubling health diagnosis.
- It could be the uncertainty of a marriage or challenging relationship.
- Or maybe it's the frustration of deciding where you'll be going to college.

In any case, there's a thick cloud surrounding you. What's worse, there's a feeling of being utterly alone as the air around you darkens. No hand to hold, only the damp, thick air of the cloud. And what about God? Where is God in all of this? Where is the hope that we long for? Where is the peace that our hearts desire?

Well, I believe that the mountain top experience of the disciples in our Gospel passage this Sunday can help us to see an important truth: **God is hidden in the darkness of the cloud.** And the temptation for us is to look for Him somewhere else.

You see, the "cloud" represents the Lord's glory and our own experiences of obscurity and confusion. The "cloud" symbolizes experiences that many of us inevitably go through in life.

- Experiences that make us uncomfortable.
- Experiences that make us forget the temporary nature of a "cloud" and the permanent nature of Jesus' promise to be with us ALWAYS.

I really believe that what the disciples were being shown on their mountain top experience was what it really means to have **FAITH!**

Faith is a kind of knowing that doesn't need to know for certain.


Because having <u>Faith is accepting the reality of the cloud and at the same time trusting that God is with you in that cloud and not somewhere else.</u>


