PASTOR'S COLUMN

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS



There is a simple story about a little boy who was afraid of the dark. Asked to step onto the back porch, he hesitated until his mother reminded him, “Jesus is out there.” Cracking the door open, the boy called out, “Jesus, if you’re out there, would you please hand me the broom?”

That childlike prayer captures today’s Gospel. ***Jesus is always with us—even in the dark.***

St. John tells us clearly that Jesus loved Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. And yet, Jesus does not rush to prevent Lazarus’ death. He allows his friends to experience grief and loss—not to punish them, but precisely because he loves them. In a fallen world, suffering is unavoidable. God permits it not because he abandons us, but because he knows that if life were free of hardship, we might mistake earth for heaven. The resurrection of Lazarus reminds us that this life is a journey toward heaven, not the destination. What matters most is not comfort, but knowing, loving, and following Jesus Christ. Our sufferings humble us, turn us back to God, and allow Him to act in our lives in deeper ways. Nothing—not even death—is beyond Christ’s redeeming power.

Friends, everything in our church proclaims this truth: **God never gives up on us!** Perhaps the most powerful sign of that is the confessional. Its very presence assures us that no matter how often we fall, Christ is ready to forgive, heal, and help us begin again.

As Lent draws to a close, let us recommit ourselves to Christ—not settling for being comfortable Christians, but striving for holiness, trusting that even in the dark, the Lord is there.

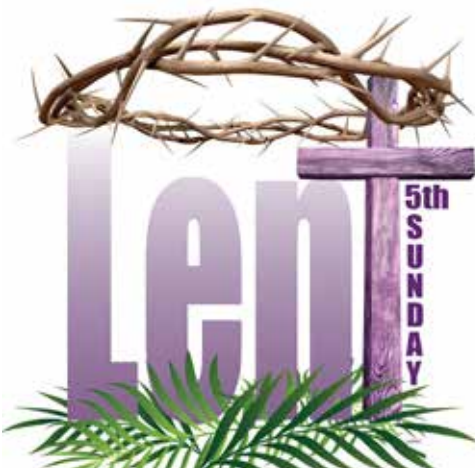

HOLY WHYS: DEACON HUGH REPLIES



Dear Deacon Hugh:

Help straighten something out for me. The church has Easter and an Easter Season, but what is a Little Easter?

Dear Friend:

Let me share with you a beautiful truth that lies at the heart of our faith. Every Sunday, when Christians gather in worship, we are not simply marking the passage of another week—we are celebrating a “little Easter.” That’s right! For the Church, Sunday is far more than a day of rest. It is the Lord’s Day, the day when Jesus Christ rose in victory from the grave. This means that each Sunday is a reminder of the new creation brought forth by our risen Lord. Pope John Paul II, in his apostolic letter *Dies Domini*, beautifully described Sunday as our “weekly Easter”—a living, ongoing celebration of Christ’s triumph over death. While the phrase “little Easter” may not appear in every official document, it is a powerful way to summarize what Sunday means for believers across the world. This idea is rooted in ancient Christian tradition, which teaches that every time we come together on Sunday, we step into the light of Resurrection morning. Each Sunday calls us to remember and rejoice in the hope, joy, and new life found in Jesus Christ.

So, friend, when you prepare your heart for worship each week, let Sunday remind you that Christ is alive! Let every “little Easter” renew your faith and fill your soul with the promise of eternal life. God bless you.

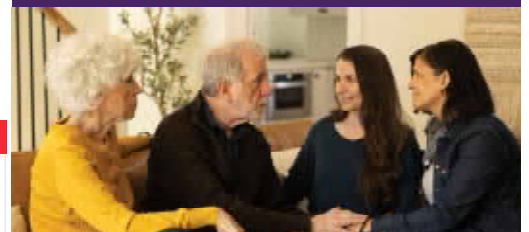
