PASTOR'S COLUMN



REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

Friends, in today's Gospel from Luke we encounter one of the greatest stories ever told. In this parable, a young brother **loses** his dignity, and an older brother **loses** touch with the love that his father has always had for him. Their father grieves because both are **lost**.

I like to refer to this parable as the *Parable of the Lost Sons* because in the story both brothers lose a lot.

I'm not sure if you remember, many years back the media mogul Ted Turner, founder of CNN and many other cable channels, described Christianity as a **"religion for losers."** And like wisdom out of a fool's mouth, he was dead right, and St. Luke would agree!

What Mr. Turner offered as an insult, St. Luke, in his Gospel and in the parable of the Prodigal Son, offers us as consolation.

You see; Yes, Christianity **is** indeed for **"losers."** And that's because at some point in our lives we experience loss.

All kinds of loss...

- Loss of money and security,
- loss of friendships and loss of confidence,
- loss of self-esteem and self-worth,
- the loss of life and the loss of Love.

Christianity **is** for those who have **lost** their way; it's for those who have **lost** hope. Christianity is for the one who has **lost** a job and for the one who has **lost** a friend. It's for the one who has **lost** his/her health, and it is for the one who has **lost** his/her wits; and the many other things we lose on the journey of life. So, Yes, Christianity is for the **losers** of this world.

And today's Gospel parable is meant to touch and fill the heart of every *loser* in a special way.

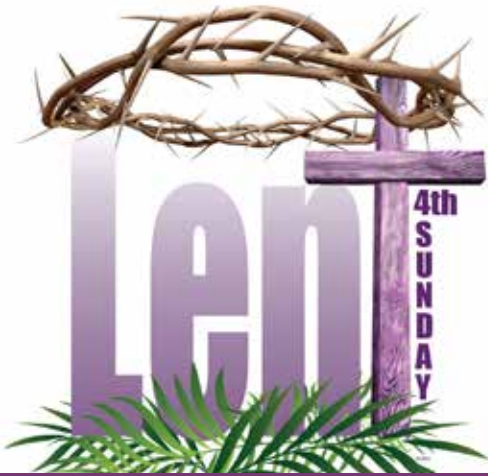

"LIGHT ON LENT"

PRAYER

"Virtues are formed by prayer. Prayer preserves temperance. Prayer suppresses anger. Prayer prevents emotions of pride and envy. Prayer draws into the soul the Holy Spirit, and raises man to Heaven."

– St. Ephrem of Syria

Prayer is the breath of the spiritual life. Without it, your soul suffocates and dies. That's why Jesus and the great saints of the Church were so urgent in their calls for us to pray always and everywhere. St. Paul commanded us to "pray without ceasing." Jesus taught us to "pray always and not lose heart."

In fact, prayer is so important that St. Alphonsus Liguori says, "Whoever prays is certainly saved. He who does not is certainly damned." Let that sink in.

Prayer is so important because, whether or not we realize it, we are essentially beggars before God. Everything we need to be virtuous men has to be given to us. We will never be holy without grace, and there is no other way to obtain grace than through prayer.

Our Lent will be completely wasted if we aren't praying. Fasting and almsgiving will simply become sources of pride if we aren't approaching them prayerfully. No matter what else you are planning to do for Lent, prayer should be first on the list.

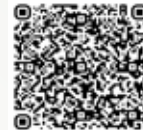


There is only **ONE** Anniversary Liturgy this year honoring couples in our Archdiocese celebrating their 5th, 25th, or 50th wedding anniversary
