Campus Redevelopment Update

The process has been steady. I previously reported that all parties had signed the contract of sale. Since the signing, the 10% deposit proceeds required under the contract have been received and escrowed by our attorney to be held until the closing.

Additionally, a preliminary meeting was held with representatives from the Springfield Township to review the subdivision plan including the plans for the proposed parish center. Based on that meeting, St. James and the Buyer are making final revisions to the subdivision to submit the application to the township for a hearing date to be scheduled. I hope to soon announce the date of the township meeting for the approval of the subdivision of the property. Please continue to keep the Campus Redevelopment team and our work in your prayers. 🙏

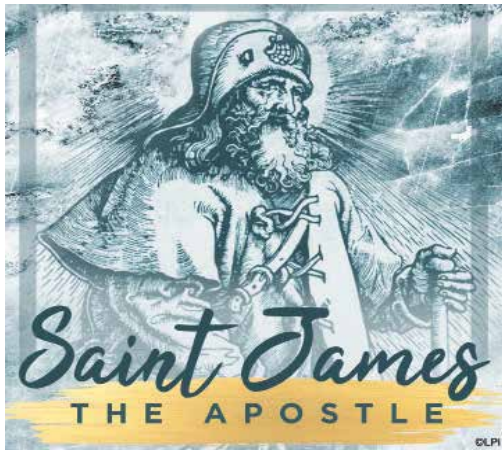

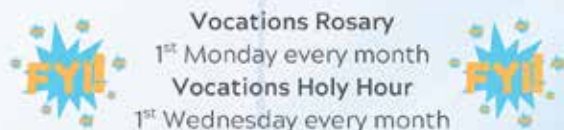

PATH TO BECOMING A PERMANENT DEACON IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Hi, my name is Darin Cerreto. My wife Lori and I along with our son Dominic are longtime parishioners at St. James the Apostle Church in Springfield, NJ. Lori and I first started attending St. James back in 1999. We were welcomed by gracious priests and an inviting community which made it easy to call St. James our parish family.

Ministry always seemed to be flourishing at St. James however for many years we remained quiet parishioners in the church. Our first step into ministry was volunteering at the Parish Festival. Through the years we became more involved in ministries and prayerful opportunities to build and share faith.

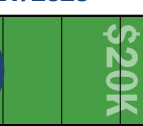

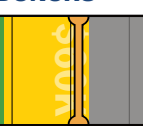

This was manifested on many occasions but was most pronounced at the wedding feast of Cana in which she interceded for the bride and groom when the supply of wine was depleted at their celebration. We can imitate a sensitivity to the needs of others by donating to the Catholic Charities Donation Bin(s) any unwanted clothing, small appliances, shoes, linens, sheets, towels, tools, stuffed animals, novels, and children's books.
