Campus Redevelopment Update

The process has been steady. I previously reported that all parties had signed the contract of sale. Since the signing, the 10% deposit proceeds required under the contract have been received and escrowed by our

attorney to be held until the closing.

Additionally, a preliminary meeting was held with representatives from the Springfield Township to review the subdivision plan including the plans for the proposed parish center. Based on that meeting, St. James and the Buyer are making final revisions to the subdivision to submit the application to the township for a hearing date to be scheduled. I hope to soon announce the date of the township meeting for the approval of the subdivision of the property. Please continue to keep the Campus Redevelopment team and our work in your prayers. 🙏




