PASTOR'S COLUMN



Message from Fr. David Santos

St. James Vocations Ministry

One of my goals when I came to St. James was to begin a Vocations Ministry in the parish. And not simply because the Church needs more young men to consider the priesthood as an honorable and viable option for a path in life but also because God created each person

with a purpose, and that purpose is meant to be lived out in a particular vocation, that is, a calling.

Ordinarily, we hear this question asked to a young person – "What do **you** want to do with your life?," or "What do **you** want to do when you grow up?" But as believers who believe that God is a Creator who creates not by chance but with intent, then the question we ought to be asking our young people is – "What does **God** want you to do with your life?"or, "What does **God** want you to do when you grow up?"

Friends, put simply, a vocation is about **responding to God's call to live a life of holiness and service** in the way that He intends for everyone. Or, better yet, God wants all of us to be with Him in heaven, and our surest path to heaven is by following our **vocation**, our **calling to a specific state in life.**

The goal of the Vocations Ministry is to build a *Culture of Vocations* in our parish.

While our new ministry will help promote **all** vocations – that is, **married life, single life, consecrated life** as a religious brother or sister, and the **priesthood** – the initial efforts of the Vocations Ministry will focus on the priesthood. Why? **Because priests bring people the Sacraments.** Without priests, there is no Eucharist, there is no Confession, there is no Anointing of the Sick.

Friends, here is a sobering statistic:

Given age distribution and ordination trends, the number of **available pastors** in the archdiocese will **decrease** significantly over 20 yrs. The archdiocese is on track for a **35% decrease in priests** over the next **10 years** (and over a 50% decrease in 20 years), which will mean 1 priest per 6600 Catholics by 2035 (currently 1/~4000, which is not enough already).

By the way, I don't think this decrease in men being ordained priests has anything to do with God. It has everything to do with the fact that young men just aren't **encouraged** or **supported** by their **families** or their **communities** when it comes to discerning a vocation to the priesthood. This needs to change so that future generations can benefit from being served by priests in their parish churches. I believe it **can** change and that it **will** change.

St. James has a track record of being open and supportive of priestly vocations. Gratefully, we have two recent vocations from the parish – Fr. Joe Furnaguera, pastor of St. Paul the Apostle in Greenville, Jersey City, and seminarian James McElroy who is currently in his first year of seminary formation at Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall University. Now is an important time in the life of the Church to redouble our efforts and encourage young men from our parish to discern the priesthood of Jesus Christ. Friends, I LOVE BEING A PRIEST! It is the greatest gift I have received in my life. Let's work together to help other young men from our parish to experience the same gift.


