PASTOR'S COLUMN



REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

Today's Gospel is a summary, in many ways, of Jesus' teaching. **Love** is the central theme this weekend. If you're wondering how I know, just count the amount of times the word "love" is repeated in our readings. The word "Love" is repeated 18 times throughout this morning's readings (yeah, I counted!).

Back in high school—and who knows, maybe in high schools even today—love was defined by carving two sets of initials into a locker, a tree, or a park bench. I had a friend who preferred the less permanent approach: She wrote them in ink on the rubber part of her sneakers. That way, if the love object changed, she could always rub him out and put the new lucky fellow in his place! Along with the initials, traditionally circumscribed with a heart, there would often be another assortment of letters describing precisely this kind of young passion and emotion. The most common one that I remember was **T.L.F.—True Love Forever**.

Teenagers are often very ambitious and idealistic about romance. "Forever," while a very long time, did not seem an abnormal period to commit to. The problem with our "forevers" is not our sincerity so much as our limitations. We are mortal; that means we are material with an expiration date that will be sooner than we think, no matter what we think. And everything else about us has its limits, too: *patience, talent, endurance, health, compassion, kindness, and love* included.

When we make our vows and speak our "forevers," we always do it while holding our breath. We *hope* to be faithful forever. At least, we're sure gonna try.

Meanwhile, in that same breath, sin is at work in us and in our world, doing its darnedest to make liars of us. Sin lurks at the edges of our goodness and our best intentions. Its victory is in our failure. The ultimate victory for sin used to be in its supreme price: the sting of death. But something looms larger than death on the horizon of our humanity, and that's what Jesus is getting at: **God's love for us**.

You see, God has no problem when it comes to "forever."

The compassion of Jesus, faithful all the way to the cross, demonstrates **that** love beyond a shadow of a doubt. Friends, if we're really looking for **T.L.F.** (true love forever), this is it! And if we hold fast to it, we are promised a joy so complete, nothing will be lacking ever again.







Why is Mental Health Awareness Important?

Despite recent strides in how our society approaches mental wellbeing, many Americans still do not have access to the high-quality, comprehensive treatment and care they need. Just look at some of the staggering data about mental health in the United States:

- > 1 in 5 U.S. adults experience mental illness each year.
- > Only 47.2% of U.S. adults with mental illness received treatment in 2021.
- > 1 in 20 U.S. adults experience serious mental illness each year.
- > Only 65.4% of U.S. adults with serious mental illness received treatment in 2021.
- > 1 in 6 U.S. youth have a mental health condition, but only half receive treatment.
- > 50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14, and 75% by age 24.




