PASTOR'S COLUMN



REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

My mother never had difficulty staying awake—she would wait up for every family member until they were home safe in their beds. Or she'd stay up all night just to make sure bags were packed and all was ready for an adventurous summer road trip the next day.

I didn't really appreciate my mother's secret to staying awake until recently. It wasn't like mom danced around the living room or drank pots of coffee to stay awake (although she was known to engage in both of those activities from time to time). But recently I read somewhere that sleep experts advise engaging in lively conversations to get your mind moving when you're feeling drowsy. Conversation—that was mom's secret during her late night vigils—conversations with God. Mom has always been a world-class pray-er. She says the rosary nightly and a Hail Mary or Our Father whenever she has the chance. She shares everything with God—her hopes and dreams for the family and her greatest concerns.

While the rest of the household slumbered, she kept watch with her best friend and was ever ready at the appointed hour. I can't help but think of my mother's superhuman-like power to wrestle sleep each time I hear Jesus' command to "stay awake!"

Friends, Advent is not our annual invitation to winter slumber and daydreams about white Christmases and chestnuts roasting on open fires. There are "days to come," Isaiah reveals, when peace will replace the violence of our churning, restless world. "Stay awake!" Jesus reminds us, so that we don't miss the signature of those days. Nor the vital decisions each of us has yet to make.

It has been the tradition here at St. James for parishioners to participate in the decorating of the narthex/gathering space Parish Christmas Tree. Each year a theme is selected, and parishioners are invited to hang an ornament that corresponds to the year's theme.

Advent and Lent are the two penitential seasons of the church year. However, Advent is a season in anticipation of the birth of Christ in time. Now, what is meant by "the birth of Christ in time"? Our four Sundays of Advent are not just Sundays in preparation for the birth of a child destined to become the Savior of the nations, but the birth of a child every day in the hearts of every Christian and the future return of the second coming in time where everything will be taken back by our God.

In today's Gospel, for some this reading might strike fear into their hearts: "...perplexed by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will die of fright." Even today, we hear about doomsday sayers professing the end of the world on a particular date. To be sure, the end of the world will come! However, we truly do not know the time. Only God knows when God will call everything to return to him.

In the final lines of today's Gospel we are told to "be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent."

This first Sunday in the season of Advent is a time for us to joyfully await the coming of Christ for the first time, at birth; for the second time, into our everyday lives; and looking forward to the last time when he will come to take all of creation back to his Father.

ADVENT WREATH

Many churches and families light Advent candles to mark the progression toward the birth of Christ. Set up three purple candles, one pink candle, and a white candle in or around a wreath somewhere in your home. Each week during Advent, a new candle is lit until all the candles burn on Christmas or Christmas Eve. The first, second and fourth candles are traditionally purple, with the third being pink (symbolizing joy). The final white candle is lit either on Christmas or Christmas Eve and is known as the Christ candle. Consider reading the Sunday Mass readings together as a family each Sunday of Advent while you light the candle for the week.
