PASTOR'S COLUMN



RELECTION ON THE READINGS

Employee handbooks feature plenty of rules— but after a few weeks on the job, it becomes clear that not all rules are created equal. For instance, the dress code policy may mandate collared shirts and close-toed shoes. But if businesses got a dollar for every time an employee got away with wearing sandals or a collar-less blouse, there would be a lot more Fortune 500 companies out there.

On the flipside, a good handbook will also instruct employees to treat everyone with respect and any action to the contrary should result in disciplinary action. It isn't that the dress code does not matter at all, but respect for persons matters more. This rule is what enables a healthy workplace culture, so it receives more attention.

Similarly, the commandments that guide our faith life vary in weight. In terms of church teachings, a comment Pope Francis makes on an airplane is significant, but a decree put forth at a Church council holds even more sway. **Then we have today's gospel**. Jesus says clearly no commandment is greater than these: you shall love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. And you shall love your neighbor as yourself. Love **God**. Love **your neighbor**. Love **yourself**! Everything else stems from these ancient calls.

As followers of Christ, baptized in the Holy Spirit, we are sent into the world to make God's steadfast love known to all of creation. We are also called to recognize the ways creation reflects God's love back to us. Friends, here two good questions for us to reflect on this week:

- 1) How do you most powerfully experience the love of God?
- 2) Where do you need help in cultivating an awareness of God's presence?





FINANCE COUNCIL CORNER 2024 State of the Parish Report

The Finance Council would like to say **THANK YOU** for your continued generosity and support of our parish. Your gifts of time, talent and treasure have enabled the parish to continue to:

- meet the fiscal needs of a growing parish;
- complete needed repairs within the parish campus:
- fulfill our parish commitments to the Archdiocese;
- cover the cost of \$70,000 of initial expense related to the future parish center project; and
- expand the great work that we are doing in carrying out our mission of spreading God's word and offering service to the community.

After all this, through June 30, 2024, our parish operated at close to breakeven. The \$13,000 deficit reflected in the report is offset by \$14,000 in grant funding that was not received as of June 30th.

We have made great strides in improving our financial position and see many positive trends and growth. See the 2024 State of the Parish Report distributed after mass the weekend of Oct 26/27. Below are some highlights:

- Increase in collections, both in pew and via online, weekly collections up 5%;
- Increase in salaries and benefits expenses;
- Increase in insurance costs:
- Completed various repairs to the church, rectory and campus grounds, much of which were covered by grants as well as parishioner donations;
- Keeping current with financial obligations and addressing old legacy debt; and an
- Increase in registered families.

The Finance Council continues to work closely with Father David to assist with managing the Parish's finances in faithfulness to our Parish mission and vision. Each of us is called on to share our gifts and talents with each other and the community. May we continue to grow together in faith and service.
